WHEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the eighth day of July next: Now, I, Sir George Gipps, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twenty-ninth day of July next; and I do hereby further announce and Proclaim, that a Session of the said Legislative Council shall be holden for the despatch of business, and that the said Council shall accordingly assemble on the afore-said twenty-ninth day of July next, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney; and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance, at the said time and place accordingly.
