SUPREME COURT RULES.

THE following General Rules and Orders of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, in its Equitable Jurisdiction, having been made by their Honors the Judges, are published for general information.

Tuesday, the 17th day of June, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

EQUITABLE JURISDICTION.

(Subpœna to rejoin where more than one defendant.)—(Time for hearing.)

1. From and after the first day of July next, there shall be but one Subpœna to rejoin in any cause, notwithstanding that there may be two or more defendants therein; but the plaintiff shall use due diligence to obtain a sufficient answer from every such defendant. And if he shall fail to do so, or (after the coming in of the several answers required,) to set his cause down, on bill and answer,

to be heard within two calendar months after the last answer being deemed sufficient, or to file a replication to each such answer, within the like time after the same being deemed sufficient, or to serve Subpœna to rejoin, within the like time after the last answer being deemed sufficient, or to set his cause down, to be heard within three calendar months after the service of such Subpœna, or to bring on the same to be heard, accordingly, on the day appointed, where the same shall be practicable; any defendant shall be at liberty to move, as a defendant may now do under the 19th Standing Rule, that the Bill be (as against him,) dismissed; and the same shall or may, if the Court shall see fit, be dismissed accordingly.

(Subpœna to hear judgment.)

2. After the said first day of July, so much of the said 19th Rule as relates to Subpœnas to hear judgment, shall be repealed; and every Subpœna to hear judgment shall be returnable, on a day not less than ten days (or in a Country cause, not less than fourteen days,) after service thereof.

## SUPREME COURT RULES.

THE subjoined General Rules, (from 1 to 7 inclusive,) having been made by their Honors the Judges, in the Common Law and general jurisdiction of the Court, are published for general information.

In the Supreme Court of New South Wales.

Tuesday, the seventeenth day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

*(Cases of Alias and Pluries Summons.)*

1. After the publication of this Rule, the Plaintiff shall not be bound to file his declaration, in any case where an *Alias* or *Pluries* Summons shall be necessary, until eight days after the time allowed for appearance, under such *Alias* or *Pluries* Summons; except where, in any action against two or more defendants, one defendant or more shall have been served with the original summons, and shall have appeared thereto; but the Plaintiff shall, notwithstanding such appearance or notice thereof given, not be bound to proceed further than the filing and delivery of such declaration, until all the defendants shall have been served.

*(Service of Defendants in such cases.)*

2. In any such action, against two or more Defendants, it shall not be necessary to serve any Defendant with the *alias* or *pluries* summons, who shall have been served with the original summons; but he shall have due notice of trial, or of assessment of damages, (as the case may require,) for the day on which the Plaintiff shall be entitled to proceed, or shall proceed against the other Defendant or Defendants, under such *alias* or *pluries* summons.

*(Juries of Twelve.)*

3. Every notice of motion for a Jury of twelve persons, under the late Act in that behalf, (8 Vict. No. 4, s. 2,) shall specify the class, (whether of Common or of Special Jurors,) from which the party will apply that they be returned; and every affidavit, in support of any such motion, shall not only state that the cause is at issue, but shall specify the several issues which are to be tried.

*(Juries of Four and Common Juries.)*

4. The days at present set apart for Common Jury causes, shall be added to those appointed for the trial of causes by Juries of four; and all rules passed for the trial of assessor causes, shall now be applied to such last-mentioned causes: provided that no more than eight causes shall hereafter be set down for any day in the first week; nor more than six causes for any subsequent day of the sittings, exclusive of *short* or *undefended* causes, of which there may be not exceeding four in each day's paper, in addition, if the Prothonotary or Chief Clerk shall see fit. Common Jury causes shall be tried, on a day or days to be appointed for that purpose, on the last day of each Term.

*(Costs of Interlocutory Proceedings.)*

5. No costs shall hereafter be allowed to the party

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succeeding in a cause, in respect of any Interlocutory motion or proceeding, unless he shall also have succeeded therein, (either in the application, if made by himself, or in his opposition thereto, as the case may be,) or unless the costs thereof shall have been awarded to him, or have been expressly made costs in the cause. But nothing in this rule shall be construed to prevent the Court or Judge, before whom any such motion or proceeding shall be had, from making such order as to the costs as such Court or Judge might have made, or might now make, without reference to this rule.

*(Court Fees, and Fees on Trial at Bar.)*

6. The Court Fees now payable on the trial of any cause, shall be hereafter demanded and paid, in respect of every day of such trial, and after the first day of next Term, whenever, in any cause, a trial at Bar shall be directed, the Fees payable on entry of such cause for trial, and for entering the verdict or nonsuit therein, and for witnesses sworn, and exhibits produced on such trial, and for the signing of final judgment, shall be double the amount payable, in respect of those matters, on an ordinary trial.

*(Citation of Rules.)*

7. In all cases hereafter, where it shall be necessary to cite or refer to any Rule of this Court, it shall be sufficient to mention the same by its date only, (or, if one of the Rules commonly called the Standing Rules, by its number,) without further description.

## ECCLESIASTICAL JURISDICTION.

Tuesday, the seventeenth day of June in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

## REGULÆ GENERALES.

*(Preamble.)—(9 Geo. IV. c. 83. Charter.)*

1. Whereas by the Act of Parliament, passed in the ninth year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, to provide for the administration of justice in this Colony, the Supremo Court of New South Wales was constituted a Court of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, with full power to execute such authority, as was and is committed to the said Court by His said Majesty's Charter or Letters Patent, bearing date at Westminster, the thirteenth day of October, in the fourth year of His reign; and whereas by the said Charter or Letters Patent, the Court is em-

powered to fix certain periods, when all persons to whom Probates of Wills and Letters of Administration shall have been granted, shall pass their accounts before the said Court; and the Court is required to make such orders as shall be just for the administration of the assets, or their safe investment and custody. It is hereby ordered that all Executors by whom the Probate of any Will shall have been obtained, and all Administrators to whom any Letters of Administration shall have been granted in this Colony, at any time after the 1st day of January, 1839, and before the 30th day of June, 1844, do, and shall severally, on or before the 30th day of August next, exhibit and cause to be filed in the Office of the Registrar and Prothonotary of this Court, a full, true, and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, and credits of the deceased Testator, or Intestate, as the case may be; and do and shall, on or before the 30th day of September next, cause to be made and exhibited to, and filed in the Office of the said Registrar, a full, true, and just account of their respective administrations; and do and shall pass their several accounts before the Court, or in vacation one of the Judges thereof, at such time or times as shall be thereafter appointed for that purpose.

*(Probate or Administration since 30th June, 1844.)*

2. It is ordered, that all Executors who shall have obtained probate, and all administrators to whom letters of administration shall have been granted, after the said thirtieth day of June, 1844, do, and shall within six calendar months next after the date of such probate or letters, (or, if that period be now elapsed, then on or before the thirtieth day of September next,) exhibit and cause to be filed in like manner, a full, true, and perfect inventory of the goods, chattels, and credits of the deceased; and do and shall within fifteen calendar months next after obtaining such probate, or administration, cause to be made and exhibited in like manner, a full, true, and just account of their respective administrations; and do and shall pass their several accounts, in like manner as aforesaid, at such times as shall be thereafter appointed, for that purpose.

*(Special notice to be given.)*

3. It is ordered, that the Registrar of this Court do, as soon as shall be practicable, give notice to the several executors and administrators, to whom the preceding rules apply, of the contents in substance of the same, particularly stating the time limited, for the filing of their inventories and accounts respectively, by the parties addressed; and on the first day of the term next following the times so limited, he shall, in open Court, report the names, in writing, of all the parties, who shall then have complied or neglected to comply with the same rules.

*(Future probates and administrations; when accounts to be filed.)*

4. Every person, to whom probate or letters of administration shall hereafter be granted, shall within six calendar months next following, exhibit and cause to be filed in the office of the Registrar and Prothonotary, a full, true, and perfect inventory of the goods, chattels, and credits of the deceased; and shall within fifteen calendar months,

after having obtained such probate or administration, cause to be made and filed in the same office, a full, true, and just account of his administration; which account shall be passed before the Court, or in vacation before one of the Judges, at such time or times as shall be thereafter appointed for that purpose; and the Registrar shall, upon the taking of the executor's oath, (in case of probate,) and upon the taking of the administrator's bond, (in case of administration,) cause a copy of this rule, with a copy of so much of the charter, as relates to the passing of accounts by executors and administrators, to be given to the party taking such oath, or entering into such bond, for his information and guidance.

*(Defaulters to be reported.)—(Further time obtainable.)*

5. On the first day of every term, the Registrar shall report in writing to the Court, the names of all the parties who shall, since the commencement of the preceding term, have complied or omitted to comply with the said rule: Provided always, that further time for the filing of any inventory or account, under these Rules or any of them, may be obtained by order of a Judge, on application for that purpose, (and sufficient cause being shown,) through the said Registrar.

*(Accounts how passed.)*

6. As soon as conveniently may be after the filing of any such account as aforesaid; the Registrar shall cause public notice thereof to be given in the *Government Gazette*; and that all parties having claims on the estate, or being otherwise interested therein, may come in before him at his office, at or before a certain time, (to be specified in such notice,) and inspect the said account; and (if they shall think fit) object thereto:—And if, at or before that time any exception shall be taken to such account, the same shall be enquired into and disposed of, and such order or orders from time to time, for that purpose, be made in the matter, as a Judge shall direct; but if no such objection be made, the account shall or may be passed, upon the oath of the Executor or Administrator alone, at any time after the expiration of the time limited by the said notice, with such allowances and Commission, as the Judge auditing the same shall think reasonable.

*(Disposal of Balances.)*

7. Upon any such account as aforesaid being so passed, the balance (if any,) remaining upon the same, in the hands of the Executor, or Administrator, not being immediately required for the purposes of the Estate, shall be paid into the hands of the said Registrar, and by him into the Saving's Bank, to the credit of the said Estate, to remain there invested, in like manner as moneys standing there to the credit of the Collector of Intestates Estates, and subject to the like Rules.

*(Suing on Administration Bonds.)*

8. The seventh of the Standing Rules of this Court, for the guidance of the Registrar, with respect to the Estates of Intestates, is hereby repealed: Provided that, in every case of neglect to comply with the preceding Rules, or any of them, the

Administration Bond of the Party failing may be put in suit, as provided by the Royal Charter, if the Court shall, on the receipt of the Registrar's Report, think fit so to order.
