The wet thermometer does not directly indicate the dew point; but in conjunction with the dry thermometer, and the height of the barometer, it affords the means by which the dew point can be calculated, either according to the Formula of Dr. Apollon, of Dublin, or by means of tables published by Professor Forbes, of Edinburgh.
