QUEANBEYAN, 1, One acre, county of Murray, parish of Queanbeyan, village of Queanbeyan, allotments Nos. 18 and 19 of section 4 ; commencing in Macquoid-street, at the north-west corner of the Roman Catholic Parsonage allotment, and bounded on the east by that allotment, being a line bearing south 40 degrees east 5 chains to the north-east corner of No. 20 allotment ; on the south by that allotment, being a line bearing south 50 degrees west 2 chains to Molonglo-street ; on the west by that street, being a line bearing north 40 degrees west 5 chains to Macquoid-street ; and on the north by that street, being a line bearing north 50 degrees east 2 chains to the north-west corner of the Roman Catholic Parsonage allotment as aforesaid.

VACCINATION.

IT having been reported to the Government that Small Pox was prevailing to a considerable extent at Manila, up to the latest date at which accounts have been received from thence, and that many persons had died of that complaint, His Excellency the Governor has directed the re-publication of the Notice of the 29th July, 1839, with a view of again drawing the attention of parents and guardians to the importance of Vaccination.

VACCINATION.

IN order to avert the calamities which must necessarily follow if the Small Pox be introduced

into the Colony, and to keep up a constant supply of Vaccine Lymph, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that children will receive Vaccination gratis, if taken to any of the Public Hospitals or Colonial Surgeons throughout the Colony, every Tuesday, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon. But as the operation itself, without any proof of its having taken effect, would be insufficient security to the public mind, His Excellency has been pleased to direct, that a charge of one shilling shall be deposited for every child vaccinated, which sum shall be returned on the presentation of the child on the next Vaccination day.

His Excellency strongly recommends to parents and guardians to avail themselves, as early as possible, of the means thus afforded to them of taking this necessary and proper precaution, with respect to all children not already vaccinated.

PARRAMATTA LEASES.

WHEREAS a petition was presented to His Excellency the Governor, on the 23rd May, 1844, from certain Leaseholders in the Town of Parramatta, the prayer of which was as follows, viz. —

“ Your Petitioners humbly trust that they may not be thought presumptuous, in venturing further to suggest to Your Excellency, that it would not more than meet the exigency if the case as regards the Leaseholders in general, whilst it would undoubtedly contribute greatly to the welfare of the Town, were a period allowed of four years, commencing from the 30th June, 1844, for the liquidation of the amounts due, according to the following scale, viz., 25 per cent. of the arrears of Quit-rent, to be paid at the expiration of each year; and 50 per cent. of the redemption fines at the expiration of each of the last two years of the above period, the occupants to remain as yearly tenants during that term, paying the stipulated rate of Quit-rent yearly, and at the expiration of the four years, the Leases to be converted into Grants in fee simple, provided all claims upon the part of the Crown shall have been paid, or if unpaid, the land to revert to the Crown;” And whereas His Excellency was pleased to accede to the prayer of the aforesaid Petition, and the period having now elapsed during which the first instalment of 25 per cent. of arrears ought to have been paid, viz., on the 30th June last; Notice is hereby given to the parties interested, that they are now required immediately to come forward and pay the several sums so due by them respectively, in accordance with the above arrangement, together with the Quit-rents due by them, for the year ending 30th June last, in failure of which, measures will be taken for enforcing payment to the extent of all arrears now due, and at the same time their several allotments will be declared to have reverted to the Crown.

**REWARD OF A TICKET OF LEAVE, OR
A CONDITIONAL PARDON.**

The wet thermometer does not directly indicate the dew point; but in conjunction with the dry thermometer, and the height of the barometer, it affords the means by which the dew point can be calculated, either according to the Formula of Dr. Apjohn, of Dublin, or by means of tables published by Professor Forbet, of Edinburgh.

SYDNEY STREETS.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the fifth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled, "An Act for better regulating the alignment of streets in the "Town of Sydney," it is amongst other things enacted, that before the Surveyor General shall set out the footway in any street, or part of a street, or public place in the said Town, after the passing of the said Act, he shall lay before the Governor and Executive Council a plan of the same, setting forth the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Governor and Council, by Notice in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*, to fix and declare the distance from the curb stone, or exterior edge of the said footway in any such street, part of a street, or public place, within which it shall not be lawful to erect any building:—And whereas the said Surveyor General has laid before the Governor and Executive Council, a plan of the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways in the under-mentioned street, and the Governor and Council have been pleased to approve the same; Notice is hereby given, that the breadth of each of the footways in the said street shall be and is hereby declared to be nine feet; and that it shall not be lawful for any person to erect any building, within nine feet of the curb-stone or exterior edge of the said footways in the said street.
