**REWARD OF A TICKET OF LEAVE OR A
CONDITIONAL PARDON.**

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that Benjamin Hall, of Mur-rurundi, and Alexander Paterson, lately in charge of Mr. John Chilcotts' Station, at Doughboy Hollow, against both of whom warrants have been issued for their apprehension, on charges of horse stealing, have effected their escape; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that in addition to the pecuniary rewards offered for the apprehension of these
