APPEALS TO THE QUEEN IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the publication for general information, of so much of the undermentioned Act, passed by the Imperial Parliament during its last Session, as relates to the admission of Appeals to Her Majesty in Council from the judgment of any Court of Justice in any British Colony or Possession.

An Act for amending an Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for the better Administration of Justice in His Majesty's Privy Council*," and to extend its Jurisdiction and Powers. [6th August, 1844.]

WHEREAS the Act passed in the fourth year of the 3 & 4, W. 4, reign of His late Majesty, intituled, "*An Act for the better Administration of Justice in His Majesty's Privy Council*," hath been found beneficial to the due Administration of Justice; and whereas another Act, passed in the sixth year 5 & 6 W. 4., of the said reign, intituled, "*An Act to amend the Law touching Letters Patent for Inventions*," hath been also found advantageous to inventors and to the public: And whereas the Judicial Committee acting under the authority of the said Acts, hath been found to answer well the purposes for which it was so established by Parliament, but it is found necessary to improve its

proceedings in some respects, for the better despatch of business, and expedient also to extend its jurisdiction and powers: And whereas by the Laws now in force in certain of Her Majesty's Colonies and Possessions abroad, no appeals can be brought to Her Majesty in Council for the reversal of the Judgments, Sentences, Decrees, and Orders of any Courts of Justice within such Colonies, save only of the Courts of Error, or Courts of Appeal within the same; and it is expedient that Her Majesty in Council should be authorised to provide for the admission of Appeals from other Courts of Justice within such Colonies or Possessions: Be it therefore enacted by the the Queen's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, that it shall be competent to Her Majesty, by any order or Her Majesty orders, to be from time to time for that by order in Council, may provide for the admission of an Appeal from any Colony, although there shall not be a Court of Error or of Appeal in such Colony; and may revoke such orders.

TWENTY FIVE POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on Tuesday, the 7th instant, the Mail on its way between Bathurst and Sydney, was stopped about sixteen miles from Bathurst, by three armed men, who, after robbing the passengers, removed the Sydney and Parramatta Mail Bags; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty-five Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who shall give such information as may lead to the apprehension and conviction of the parties guilty of the above outrage; and if the person giving the said information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

REWARD OF A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that early on the morning of the 27th December last, a violent outrage was committed at the dwelling house of the Reverend Michael O'Reilly, at Bathurst, by some person or persons unknown, who discharged fire arms loaded with shot, &c., into Mr. O'Reilly's bed room; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that in addition to the pecuniary Reward offered by the Inhabitants of the District of Bathurst, to any person or persons who may give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the perpetrators of the outrage, in the event of the party giving the said information being a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

THE following additional Rules of Practice and proceeding for the conduct of business in the Courts of Request of the Colony, have been settled by me, with the assistance of Roger Therry, Esq., Commissioner of the Courts of Requests of the County of Cumberland, pursuant to the Act of Council, 6th Victoria, No. 15.

In Witness whereof I have hereto set my hand at Government House, Sydney, this seventeenth day of January, 1845.

(Appropriation of Fees.)

41.—That the following scale shall be adopted for regulating the appropriation of the fees taken by the Officers of the Court of Requests, for their several and respective services, pursuant to Act of Council, 6th Victoria, No. 15, section 39, viz:—

That the fees receivable for process in the several Courts shall be distributed in the following proportions to the several Officers of the Court for their several and respective services; one-third of the amount shall be paid to the Commissioner, and the remaining two-thirds shall be appropriated to the payment of the Registrar, Clerks, Bailiffs, and other Officers of the Court, in the proportions in which they have been hitherto severally and respectively remunerated by salaries for their services.

(Particulars filed in Action to be explicit.)

42.—That all particulars filed in any action shall be explicit, and shall specify items, dates, and amounts, with reasonable certainty, and if money has been paid on account, such particulars shall specify it, and state the balance for which the plaintiff seeks to recover.

(Defendant failing to file plea, &c., judgment to go by default.)

43.—That if any defendant shall fail to file his plea, defence, or set-off, within the time limited by these Rules, the plaintiff shall be entitled to a judgment by default, and the facts stated in his demand or plaint, filed as aforesaid, shall be taken to be admitted by the said defendant, and it shall only be necessary for the said plaintiff in any such action to prove the amount of damage sustained by him against such defendant: Provided always; that the said Commissioner, upon good cause being shewn by the said defendant for not filing his said plea, defence, or set off, within the time aforesaid, may allow such defendant, either upon terms or otherwise, or with, or without payment of costs, to come in and defend such action.

(Plaintiff confined to cause set forth in plaint.)

44.—That at the trial of the cause, the plaintiff shall be confined in his proof to the cause of action set forth in his demand or plaint, and to the items contained in his particulars.

(Appearance of Defendant to constitute a waiver of irregular service of summons.)

45.—That if a defendant in any cause appear at the trial thereof, either in person or by his counsel or attorney, such appearance shall be deemed a waiver of any irregularity in the service of the summons issued in such cause; but if in consequence of such irregular service; any such defendant shall not have had sufficient time to prepare his defence, the Commissioner may postpone the hearing of the cause to a future day, either with or without the costs of the defendant's appearance, to obtain such further trial.

(Plaint may be amended in certain cases.)

46.—That the Commissioner may, at any time, allow any amendment to be made in any demand, plaint, particulars, plea, set-off, or other proceeding, either in form or substance, if the party against whom such amendment is sought to be made, has not been misled or prejudiced by the defect intended to be amended, or upon payment of the reasonable costs of the opposite party occasioned by such defect, and the amendment thereof.

(If Defendant appear and Plaintiff do not, non-suit may be entered.)

47.—That if a Defendant in any case above £10, shall appear in person, or by his Clerk or Servant, or by his Attorney, at the hearing of the case, and the Plaintiff shall fail to appear, either in person, or by his Clerk or Servant, or by his Attorney, to conduct the said case, as required by the 46th section of the said Act of Council, a non-suit may be entered for the Defendant.

(17th Rule of Practice repealed.)

48.—That the 17th Rule of Practice and proceeding is hereby repealed, and henceforward the following Rule shall be substituted in lieu thereof.

In all Actions tried in the several Courts of Requests, in which there shall be a verdict in favor of Plaintiff, the amount of costs arising from fees of Office, recoverable from the Defendant, shall be the same amount as that paid by Plaintiff or Attorney, in filing the plaint, unless it shall appear to the Commissioner at the hearing of the case, that a less amount ought to be awarded.

(Attorney on filing Bill of Costs, to give notice of time for taxing.)

49.—In all cases of Bills of Costs filed by an Attorney for proceedings taken in the several Courts, he shall at the time of filing the same give notice to the Plaintiff or Defendant, as the case may be, that he will, within three days, proceed to tax the same before the Registrar of the Court, and should such Plaintiff or Defendant or his Attorney, neglect to attend at such taxation, he shall be deprived of the benefit of any reduction he might otherwise claim; provided however that upon reasonable cause shewn it shall be lawful for the Commissioner to direct a fresh taxation of such costs, either generally or in respect of particular items.

(Registrar or Chief Clerk to tax Costs.)

50.—That all Bills of Costs for taxation be taxed by the Registrar of the Court, or in his absence the Chief Clerk thereof.

(Table of Costs Established.)

51.—That the 37th Rule as regards Attorneys Costs, is hereby repealed, and that the following scale of Fees for the conduct of business in the several Courts be established; and that the proper Officer do tax and allow all Bills of Costs according to such scale.

CONDITIONS.

QUALITIES OF THE SUPPLIES.

1. All the articles shall be of the best quality of their several kinds.

2. The Bread shall be the produce of clean sound Wheat, Barley, and Maize, from which, on the Military Ration 20 per cent., and on the Convict Ration 10 per cent., has been extracted in bran and waste. The Wheaten Bread shall be made in loaves of 3lbs., and the Mixed Bread in loaves of 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. each, and baked 24 hours before being issued; and parties Tendering are requested to observe, that the most rigid adherence to the conditions as to the quality of the Bread, shall be invariably enforced.

3. 8. The Forage shall be delivered by the Contractor at the Establishments where the Horses or Cattle are stationed; and in case the whole Ration of Forage be not required or delivered, each of the species shall be reckoned as the proportion of the Ration undermentioned, viz:—

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

9. Parties Tendering may do so by either of the three following modes, at their option, viz:—

3. as Umpire, who, in event of the Arbitrators not agreeing in opinion, will be called upon for his decision, which shall be final, the only question referred to the Board, or to the Arbitrators, will be, whether or not the article objected to, be such as by his Contract, the Contractor is bound to deliver; and, if the Board, Arbitrators, or Umpire, shall decide that the article is not according to the Conditions of the Contract, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which it will be procured, and the expense charged to his account. 12. It shall be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the Contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three calendar months to the opposite Party, and to end the Contract at the expiration of that period, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the Contract is made, or agreed to be made; and not later than the 1st of August.

16. 17.
