PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the GOVERNOR of New South Wales, with the advice of the Legislative Council, passed in the sixth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "*An Act to provide for the division of the Colony of New South Wales into Electoral Districts, and for the election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council,*" it was amongst other things enacted, that as divers of the Electoral Districts appointed by the said Act were far distant from the seat of Government, and of great extent, and unforeseen difficulties or delays might arise, in carrying into effect the several provisions in the said Act mentioned, in regard to the Elections for the said Districts, no Election for any of the said Districts should be held to be void, in consequence, solely, of any such delay in the holding of such Election at the time appointed, or in the return of the Writ, or of any impediment of a mere

formal nature: Provided that the validity of such Election should be declared by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, within thirty days from the day on which such Election was held, or ought to have been held: Provided further, that any measure so adopted by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, should be duly notified by Proclamation in the New South Wales *Government Gazette*: And whereas a Writ was issued for the election of a Member, to serve in the Legislative Council, for the Electoral District of the Northumberland Boroughs, which Writ was made returnable on the sixteenth day of the present month of September: And whereas the Returning Officer duly appointed for the said Electoral District, hath certified, that in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, PATRICK GRANT, Esquire, was chosen by a majority of votes, to be such Member for the said District, but the said Writ was not returned to the Governor within the period therein prescribed, as directed by the said Act:—Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, as such Governor aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation, issued with the advice of the Executive Council aforesaid, declare that the Election of the said PATRICK GRANT, Esquire, to serve in the Legislative Council, for the Electoral District aforesaid, is valid, notwithstanding the delay in the return of the Writ of Election.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this 19th day of September, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and in the ninth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MEMO.—In some former Abstracts of the Meteorological Journal, the words "Dew Point" have been inadvertently inserted instead of "Wet Thermometer"; Notice of this mistake is therefore hereby given, for the information of persons who may have filed or kept the Abstracts. The wet thermometer does not directly indicate the dew point; but in conjunction with the dry thermometer, and the height of the barometer, it affords the means by which the dew point can be calculated, either according to the Formula of Dr. Apollon, of Dublin, or by means of tables published by Professor Forbes, of Edinburgh.
