GOVERNMENT HOUSE AND LANDS, PARRAMATTA.

WITH reference to an advertisement, dated the 15th July last, His Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct it to be notified, that the Government House and Domain, at Parramatta, will be let in two lots, as described hereunder; and that Tenders from persons disposed to rent the same, will be received at this Office, at any time not later than Twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 15th November next.

The first lot will comprise the entrance lodge, dwelling house, offices, stabling, garden, dairy, men's huts, and farm buildings, with the whole of the land formerly attached thereto, and charted on the map in the Surveyor General's Office, as the Government Domain, containing about one thousand acres.

From this lot the following buildings will be excluded, being reserved for the use of the persons at present occupying them, viz. :—

- 1st.—The Observatory.
- 2nd.—The building known by the name of the Mud Lodge, now occupied by a constable.
- 3rd.—The lodge near the Flag Staff, now occupied by Mrs. Abbott, the widow of a constable, murdered whilst in the execution of his duty.
- 4th.—The building known by the name of the Laundry, which has been in the occupation (for the last twenty years,) of Mrs. Abel.

This lot will be let for either one or three years, at the option of the party tendering.

The rent is to be paid yearly in advance, or, if

not so paid, a bond, with two responsible sureties, (to be named in the tender,) for the punctual payment of the rent quarterly, will be required.

Security must also be given for the upholding the buildings, fences, &c., in their present condition, and for delivering up the same, on the expiration of the term for which they may be let, in as good a state as when entered upon, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

The second lot, comprising the remainder of the land (but without the stone quarries) hitherto attached to the Government House, and consisting of upwards of fifteen hundred acres, will be let upon similar terms.

The Leases will commence from and after the 1st January next, when possession will be given; and it is expressly to be understood, that no Timber on the premises is to be sold, or appropriated to any other purpose than for household use and for repairing the buildings and fences, under a penalty to be expressed in the bond.

COMPARATIVE STATEMENT OF THE PREVALENCY OF THE VARIOUS WINDS.—RELATIVE RANGE OF BAROMETER, &c.

Memo:—In some former Abstracts of the Meteorological Journal, the words "Dew Point" have been inadvertently inserted instead of "Wet Thermometer"; Notice of this mistake is therefore hereby given, for the information of persons who may have filed or kept the Abstracts. The wet thermometer does not directly indicate the dew point; but in conjunction with the dry thermometer, and the height of the barometer, it affords the means by which the dew point can be calculated, either according to the Formula of Dr. Apjohn, of Dublin, or by means of tables published by Professor Forbes, of Edinburgh.
