PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight,
Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the
Territory of New South Wales and its Depen-
dencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of the Governor
and Legislative Council of New South
Wales, passed in the third year of the reign of His
late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled,
“*An Act to consolidate and amend the laws for
the transportation of offenders in New South
Wales, and for defining the respective powers
and authorities of General Quarter Sessions,
and of Petty Sessions, and for determining the
places at which the same shall be holden, and
for better regulating the summary jurisdiction
of Justices of the Peace, and for repealing
certain laws and ordinances relating thereto,*”
it was amongst other things enacted, that the Courts
of General Quarter Sessions for the said Colony
should be holden at such times respectively as the
Governor for the time-being should by any Pro-
clamation duly issued for such purpose appoint:
Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power
and authority so vested in me by the said recited
Act, do hereby direct and appoint, that the said Courts
of General Quarter Sessions shall be holden during
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and forty-six, at the several times and places hereinafter
respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

AT PARRAMATTA.—On Tuesday, the 6th of January;
Wednesday, the 1st of April; Wednesday,
the 1st of July; and Tuesday, the 6th of October.

AT MAITLAND.—On Monday, the 12th of January;
the 6th of April; the 6th of July; and the 12th
of October.

AT SYDNEY.—On Monday, the 2nd of February,
the 4th of May; the 3rd of August; and the 2nd
of November; and also by adjournment of such
Sessions respectively on Tuesday, the 10th of
March; the 9th of June; the 15th of September;
and the 8th of December.

AT BERRIMA.—On Thursday, the 26th of February;
the 28th of May; the 3rd of September;
and the 26th of November.

AT BATHURST.—On Thursday, the 19th of March;
the 18th of June; the 24th of September, and
the 17th of December.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight,
Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the
Territory of New South Wales and its Depen-
dencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and
Legislative Council of New South Wales,
passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present
Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, “*An Act to con-
solidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of
Requests, and to extend the Jurisdiction of such
Courts in the County of Cumberland,*” it was
amongst other things enacted, that from and after
the 1st day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests

should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should, by Proclamation for that purpose, from time to time appoint:—And it was further enacted, that Courts should be holden in the County of Cumberland, in which Courts besides a power and authority to hear and determine, in a summary way, all Actions for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage, to an amount not exceeding Ten Pounds, Actions also to the amount of Thirty Pounds of the nature authorised by the above recited Act, should be heard and determined:—Now, I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint, that Courts of Requests, in and for the County of Cumberland, shall be holden during the year 1846, at the times and places, and for the Districts hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

The Ordinary Sittings of the Court of Requests, for the trial of all cases not exceeding Ten Pounds, shall be holden on the following days respectively, namely:—Monday, 12th January; Monday, 9th February; Friday, 13th March; Monday 13th April; Monday, 18th May; Monday, 15th June; Monday, 20th July; Monday, 17th August; Friday, 18th September; Monday, 12th October; Monday, 16th November; Monday, 14th December, respectively, at the City of Sydney, for the Police District thereof, as described in a certain Notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date, 15th day of September, 1841, and published in the New South Wales Government Gazette.

The New Sittings of the said Court, for the trial of all cases from Ten to Thirty Pounds, shall be holden on the following days respectively, namely:—on Monday, 16th February; Monday, 20th April; Monday, 22nd June; Monday, 24th August; Monday, 19th October; Monday, 21st December respectively, at the City of Sydney, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid Notice.

"The Ordinary Sittings" of the Court for the other Districts in the County of Cumberland, will commence on the undermentioned dates; and the "New Sittings" of the Court for those Districts respectively, shall commence immediately at the close of the "Ordinary Sittings."

At the Town of Campbelltown, for such portions of the Police District thereof as are situated in the County of Cumberland; and for such portions of the Police District of Camden and Narellan as are situated in the County of Cumberland, as described in the aforesaid Notice:—On Monday, 19th January; Monday, 27th April; Monday, 27th July; Monday, 26th October respectively.

At the Town of Liverpool, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid Notice:—On Wednesday, 21st January; Wednesday, 29th April; Wednesday, 29th July; Wednesday, 28th October respectively.

At the Town of Parramatta, for the Police District thereof, as described in the aforesaid Notice:—On Thursday, 22nd January; Thursday, 30th April; Thursday, 30th July; Thursday, 29th October respectively.

At the Town of Windsor, for such portions of the Police District thereof, as are situated in the County of Cumberland, as described in the aforesaid Notice:

—On Monday, 26th January; Monday, 4th May; Monday, 3rd August; Monday, 2nd November respectively.

At the Town of Penrith, for such portions of the Police District thereof as are situated in the County of Cumberland, as described in the aforesaid Notice:—On Thursday, 29th January; Thursday, 7th May; Thursday, 6th August; Thursday, 5th November respectively.

GOVERNMENT HOUSE AND LANDS, PARRAMATTA.

WITH reference to an advertisement, dated the 15th July last, His Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct it to be notified, that the Government House and Domain, at Parramatta, will be let in two lots, as described hereunder; and that Tenders from persons disposed to rent the same, will be received at this Office, at any time not later than Twelve o'clock, on Saturday, the 15th November next.

The first lot will comprise the entrance lodge, dwelling house, offices, stabling, garden, dairy, men's luts, and farm buildings, with the whole of the land formerly attached thereto, and charted on the map in the Surveyor General's Office, as the Government Domain, containing about one thousand acres.

From this lot the following buildings will be excluded, being reserved for the use of the persons at present occupying them, viz:—

- 1st.—The Observatory.
- 2nd.—The building known by the name of the Mud Lodge, now occupied by a constable.
- 3rd.—The lodge near the Flag Staff, now occupied by Mrs. Abbott, the widow of a constable, murdered whilst in the execution of his duty.
- 4th.—The building known by the name of the Laundry, which has been in the occupation (for the last twenty years,) of Mrs. Abel.

This lot will be let for either one or three years, at the option of the party tendering.

The rent is to be paid yearly in advance, or, if not so paid, a bond, with two responsible sureties, (to be named in the tender,) for the punctual payment of the rent quarterly, will be required.

Security must also be given for the upholding the buildings, fences, &c., in their present condition, and for delivering up the same, on the expiration of the term for which they may be let, in as good a state as when entered upon, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

The second lot, comprising the remainder of the land (but without the stone quarries) hitherto attached to the Government House, and consisting of upwards of fifteen hundred acres, will be let upon similar terms.

The Leases will commence from and after the 1st January next, when possession will be given; and it is expressly to be understood, that no Timber on the premises is to be sold, or appropriated to any other purpose than for household use and for repairing the buildings and fences, under a penalty to be expressed in the bond.
