BANKS' STRAITS.

Port Office, Hobart Town,
26th November, 1845.

A Light is now, and will continue burning, from sun-set to sun-rise, on Swan Island, (Banks' Straits,) 101 feet above high-water mark.

The supporting column is 74 feet 6 inches in height; the upper part coloured red, the lower part white. Its diameter is 24 feet 6 inches at the base, and 17 feet 6 inches at the summit.

The Lantern is 10 feet high, having a revolving light, which shows a bright flash of 2½ seconds continuance at intervals of a minute. It has been seen on either side from a distance of 25 miles.

The following magnetic bearings were taken from the light:—

Peak of Cape Barren.....N. 18° 47' E.
Look-out Rock (Clarke's Island) N. 19° 45' W.
Reef north-westward of Swan Is-

land.....N. 46° 0' W.
Black Reef.....S. 52° 0' E.

Variation 10 degrees easterly.

It is also expected that the light now preparing on Goose Island will be ready for exhibiting on 1st February, 1846.

Goose Island is the western of the Chappell Islands. The column which stands on the southern point of the Island, is in every respect similar to that which has been erected on Swan Island.

The light will be a fixed light. The following magnetic bearings were taken from the Light-house:—

Reef off ditto.....N. 30° W.

Extreme of Reef off north-west point

of Badger Island.....N. 34° E.
South Point of Badger Island.....N. 85° E.

lands.....S. 63° E.
South extreme of Clark's Island.....S. 54° E.

Centre of Kangaroo Island.....N. 20° E.

CENSUS.

IT is hereby notified that under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 9 Victoria, No. 21, intitled "An Act for taking an account of the population of New South Wales," the Boundaries of the Counties or reputed Counties of Bourke, Grant, and Normandy, in the Southern or Port Phillip District of the Colony, have, for the purposes of the said Act, been thus defined, that is to say:—

The County of Bourke.—Bounded on the south-west and west by the Werriby River from its mouth to its source, in the great Dividing Range; on the north by the great Dividing Range from the source of the Werriby to that of the Plenty River; on the east by the Plenty River from its source to its confluence with the Yarra Yarra River, thence upward by that River to the confluence of the Deep Creek—thence by the Deep Creek upward to the point where the main stream commences to run in a north-westerly direction,—thence by a line southerly from the aforesaid bend to Dandenong Creek,—thence by the Dandenong Creek, downward to the shores of the Port Phillip Bay; and on the South by the shores of the Port Phillip Bay to the mouth of the Werriby aforesaid.

The County of Grant.—Bounded on the east by the western Boundary of the County of Bourke; on the north by the Dividing Range extending from Mount Blackwood to Mount Buneryong; on the west by Williamson's Creek to its confluence with the Yarrowee River, by that River to its confluence with the Barwon, by the Barwon River upward to its source, and by a line south to the sea coast; and on the south and remainder of the coast by the sea coast, and the waters of Port Phillip.

The County of Normandy.—Bounded on the west by the Glenelg River from its mouth to where the Wannon joins it; on the north by the Wannon and Grange Burn, thence by a line easterly to Lake Linlithgow, following Cameron's Creek to its source, and by a line south easterly to the head of Muston's Creek; on the east by Muston's Creek to its junction with the Hopkin's River, following the course of that River until it reaches the sea; and on the south by the sea shore to the mouth of the Glenelg including the Lawrence, Lady Julia Percys Island, and the small islands at Port Fairy.
