PROCLAMATION.

By his Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th year of her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that at 11 o'clock of Wednesday, the 25th day of June next, the following Suburban Lots of land will be offered for sale by Public Auction, at the Survey Office, in Melbourne, Port Phillip, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions, and under the provisions of the above recited Act.
