On this principle a station or run, although consisting of twenty-tive square miles, may nevertheless, if in sufficient to feed four thou and sheep, or their equivalent in cattle, be enlarged to the extent requisite for that purpose. Existing runs will not be reduced below sixten thousand acres or twenty-five square miles, because they are suffitwenty-five square miles, because they are suffi-cient for more than four thousand slice (or six bundred and forty cattle); neither, on the other hand, will existing tuns be entarged, becaus
