**VACCINATION.**

IT having been reported to the Government that Small Pox was prevailing to a considerable extent at Manila, up to the latest date at which accounts have been received from thence, and that many persons had died of that complaint, His Excellency the Governor has directed the re-publication of the Notice of the 29th July, 1839, with a view of again drawing the attention of parents and guardians to the importance of Vaccination.

**VACCINATION.**

IN order to avert the calamities which must necessarily follow if the Small Pox be introduced into the Colony, and to keep up a constant supply of Vaccine Lymph, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that children will receive Vaccination gratis, if taken to any of the Public Hospitals or Colonial Surgeons throughout the Colony, every Tuesday, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon. But as the operation itself, without any proof of its having taken effect, would be insufficient security to the public mind, His Excellency has been pleased to direct, that a charge of one shilling shall be deposited for every child vaccinated, which sum shall be returned on the presentation of the child on the next Vaccination day.

His Excellency strongly recommends to parents and guardians to avail themselves, as early as possible, of the means thus afforded to them of taking this necessary and proper precaution, with respect to all children not already vaccinated.

**I**MPOUNDED at Morang, River Plenty, 12th August, 1845:—

One brown sided cow, grey face and back, white tail, grey breast, white along the belly, AK on rump near side, A on rump milking side, a blotch brand supposed to be W and 2A on ribs milking side, the top part of A visible.

One red sided cow, white rump and down along the thigh, hind legs and belly white, tip of tail white, star on forehead, FN on ribs, milking side G, supposed to be Captain Harrison's brand, ILB on shoulder milking side, the B, a blotch only supposed to be a B.
