SAILING DIRECTIONS FOR GULF ST VINCENT.

VINCENT.

Aften making Kangaroo Island, steer E. J. N. through Investigator's Straits, between that island and Althorpe Island. Should the wind be from the castward, you will find no difficulty in beating through the Straits, nor anything in the way more than is pointed out in Flinders's chart. If bound up Gulf St. Vincent great care is requisite to avoid Troubridge Shoul, situated on the west side of the entrance, as the flood tide through Backstairs Passage sets strong (particularly on the full and change of the mone) directly upon the shoul; therefore, coming from the westward, the course should not be altered until Point Marsden bears S.W. by W. J. W., when you will be about ten miles from the high land inside Cape Jervis, ramed in Flinders's chart N.W. Bluff, when you may shape your course for the Light Vessel, N.N. E., forty miles distant. For about six leagues up the Gulf, the land is high and bold; but above that, the shore becomes very low, with hummocks of sand upon it; and the same description of coast prevails to the head of the Gulf.

Be careful of your soundings, farticularly at night; and in running up to the pight, keep, as nearly as you can, in between Lve and six fathoms water—not approaching inside for a within the latter that the state of the same state of the same state. heard, seep, as hearly as you cain, no between Lve and six fathoms water—not approaching in-fide five, as within that depth the water shoals uddenly; and if you keep outside six fathoms, sou may pass to the westward of the Light and see it. In these soundings you will make

the Light ahead, which may be seen twelve miles from the deck of a ship. The shoal—called the Bar—at the entrance to the Port, bears N.E. one mile from the Light Vessel. When you are within a proper distance, a boat will be sent to you from the Light Vessel with a pilot, and to receive all mails and letters. Should you sight the Light in the early part of the night, you may anchor anywhere to the southward of it in six fathoms, or keep under weigh until day-light, taking care to be to the southward of the Light, and as near it as possible in the morning, as the tide answers early. Where the Light Vessel is moored; in latitude 34.9 44' S., the anchorage is safe, but a good full scope of chain is required, neverless then fifty fathoms; and if it blow, a full chain. When bound down the Gulf, steer from the Light Vessel S.S.W., which will keep you in sight of the land on the cast side of the Gulf, and sight of the land on the east side of the Gulf, and out of the influence of the tide through Backstairs Passage, until you are to the southward of Trous bridge Shoal; but on no account shape a consentat you may fancy will enable you to weather the Shoal, (thereby laying the ship's broadside exposed to a rapid tide running directly upon it,) until you are sufficiently to the southward to shape your course down the Strait.

In beating down the Gulf, never exceed a distance of ten miles from the larbourd shore (as the opposite side is a shoal) and be careful, when standing in, to have a cast of the lead, as it is a shoal a considerable distance off, until you get down to the high land. In some places to the northward of Holdfast Bay, there are not more than five fathoms at a distance of, four miles from the beach, and the water shoals very quickly within that depth; but where the high land fronts the sea, the shore is steep, except a reef that lies a mile off, about three miles to the southward of Holdfast Bay. The Flag Staff at Holdfast Bay is in latitude 34 ° 58' 28" S. In moderate weather, endeavour to be as close to the land as possible by sunset, when you will be certain of the wind off the land, which will lead you down the coast. Do not allow yourself to be thrown off until you are well down with Cape Jervis,

and to the southward of Troubridge Shoal, which

and to the southward of Protorings Shout, which is an extensive flat, and only in the middle shows a patch of about 200 yards at high water. Ships bound down Investigator's Strait meeting a strong westerly wind, and wishing to anchor, will find good holding ground close in on the east side of Point Marsden, in six fathoms water.

Vessels coming from the eastward through Backstairs Passage, and bound up the Gulf, should night be approaching, must keep on the north side of the Passage, and haul round Cape Jervis—all that coast being quite bold. When the Gulf is open, shape a course N. by E. ½ E. for the Light Vessel.

CONVEYANCE OF MAILS'IN 1846.

ONVEYANCE being required for the Post Office Mails as undermentioned, for one year, from the let January, 1846; persons disposed to contract for providing the same are invited to transmit their offers, in writing to this office, by Twelve o'clock on Monday, the 3rd day of November next, endorsed "Tender for Conveyance of Mails," viz.

From Melbourne by way of Bunnenyong and the Grange, to Portland, and for the return thereof by the same route, once a week.

From and to Melbourne and the Post Office near Mount Macedon, once a week.

From and to Port Fairy and Fiery Creek, once

From the Post Office in Melbourne to vessels in Hobson's Bay twice a day; and from vessels in Hobson's Bay, to the Post Office in Melbourne as often as mails may arrive; always by the Eastern Beach.

The time proposed to be occupied on the line of road must be stated in the offer, and as expedition is so desirable a point in Post Office communication, the tender proposing the quickest rate of travelling, if combining cheapness, will of course receive preference.

Contractors are to carry, all bags delivered to them under authority of the Postmasters, and to provide dry covering for the mails on horseback. Carriage conveyance will be preferred. where practicable.

Contractors are to receive letters from parties on the line of road, to be delivered at the Pest Office first arrived at, but are not to depart from direct line of road to collect the same; under penalty of five shillings for refusal.

Contractors will be bound to 'prevent the conveyance of any letter or packet for fee or hire to the prejudice of the Post Office revenue, under

penalty of five pounds for each offence.

Fixed hours will be arranged for departure and arrival of the mails, under penalty for delay.

Horses, vehicles and postmen to be subject to approval of the Postmaster at Melbourne.

Each party tendering or an agent for him, must attend at this office on the day appointed for opening the tenders.

Printed forms of tenders may be had on application at any of the Post Offices, and any further particulars may be learned from the Postmaster at Alelbourne.
