## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such Courts in the County of Cumberland,*" it was amongst other things enacted, that from and after the first day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should, by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint. And it was further enacted, that Courts should be holden in the County of Cumberland, in which Courts, besides a power and authority to hear and determine in a summary way, all Actions for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage to an amount not exceeding Ten Pounds; Actions also to the amount of Thirty Pounds, of the nature authorised by the above recited Act, should be heard and determined. And whereas by an Act passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to amend the laws respecting the recovery of small Debts in all parts of the Colony,*" it is enacted, that from and after the first day of January, which will be in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, the Courts of Requests to be holden in and for the Town of Melbourne, and County of Bourke, in the District

of Port Phillip, shall exercise such and the same jurisdiction in all respects as the Courts of Requests in the said County of Cumberland; and that the said first recited Act shall, from the said first day of January, be in force and apply to the said Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, and to the Courts of Requests to be held therein: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint, that Courts of Requests, in and for the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, shall be holden, during the year One thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, at the Town of Melbourne, at the times hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

The "Ordinary Sittings" of the Court of Requests for the trial of all cases not exceeding Ten Pounds, shall be holden on the first Mondays and following days of the Months of January, February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November, and December.

The "New Sittings" of the said Court for the trial of all cases from Ten to Thirty Pounds, shall be holden on the following days respectively, viz.: Thursday, 7th January; Thursday, 8th April; Thursday, 8th July; Thursday, 7th October.

**PUBLIC THOROUGHFARES.**

**I**T having been represented to the Government, that fences have been erected in several places across the usual line of road, by persons holding Depasturing Licences in the Districts beyond the boundaries of location, whereby great public inconvenience has been sustained, His Excellency the Governor deems it necessary to point out, that a Licence to depasture gives no right to the party holding it, to place obstructions upon Crown Land which has hitherto been used as a customary public thoroughfare, or is necessary as a way to more distant stations ; and His Excellency therefore, calls upon all persons who have caused such obstructions, to remove the same without delay.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, for general information, that by an Act of the British Parliament passed in the Session of the eighth and ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, "*An Act to regulate the trade of British possessions abroad,*" it was enacted

" That the privileges granted to Foreign Ships shall be limited to the Ships of those Countries which, having Colonial Possessions, shall grant the like privileges of trading with those Possessions to British Ships, or which, not having Colonial Possessions, shall place the Commerce and Navigation of this Country, and of its Possessions abroad, upon the footing of the most favored Nation, unless Her Majesty by Her Order in Council shall in any case deem it expedient to grant the whole or any of such privileges to the Ships of any Foreign Country, although the conditions aforesaid shall not in all respects be fulfilled by such Foreign Country : Provided always, that no Foreign Country shall be deemed to have fulfilled the before mentioned conditions or to be entitled to the privileges aforesaid, unless and until Her Majesty shall by some order or orders by Her made or to be made by the advice of Her Privy Council, have declared that such Foreign Country hath so fulfilled the said Conditions, and is entitled to the said privileges."

**PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.**

**A**LL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury, are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands, respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each may be credited in the accounts of the year within which it was received.

The heads of Departments and other officers who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof; and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury the unexpended balance of such advances, that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to the 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that, if possible, all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.

**H**IS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct, that the Notice from this Office of the 1st May, 1846, respecting Indulgences to Convicts, be republished; and that the particular attention of all persons in charge of Convict Establishments be drawn to the periods of probation necessary to entitle Prisoners to have their applications forwarded for His Excellency's decision.

These periods are on no account to be abridged, unless for some special meritorious service, to be separately reported on through the Principal Superintendent of Convicts; and it is to be explained to all Prisoners seeking indulgence, that the caution given in the last paragraph of the Regulations referred to will in future be rigidly enforced.

#### INDULGENCES TO CONVICTS.

**C**IRCUMSTANCES appearing to require a revision of the Regulations under which Tickets of Leave and Conditional Pardons are now granted to Prisoners of the Crown in this Colony, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct, that the following modifications be adopted in these Regulations from the date hereof.

1.—Without reference to the periods fixed by former Regulations, any Convict who may have served three entire years without punishment, and without any record of misconduct being made against him, may apply in the usual manner for a Ticket of Leave; and if on the investigation of his case, he appear to be deserving of the indulgence, and no legal or other impediment exist to his receiving it, a Ticket of Leave will be granted to him, and will remain in force during the Governor's pleasure.

2.—In like manner, any person who may have held a Ticket of Leave with continued good conduct during a period of not less than three years, and may be recommended by not less than three Magistrates or other persons of respectability known to the Government, may apply, by Petition, to the Governor for a Conditional Pardon.

In promulgating these Regulations, however, the Governor feels it necessary to remark, that his attention has been drawn to the unnecessary labour which is occasioned in the Department of the Principal Superintendent of Convicts, by the irregular and improper applications of persons for indulgences which they are not entitled to ask for; and His Excellency gives this general Notice, that all persons who may hereafter by their applications give unnecessary trouble of any sort, will expose themselves to the loss of the advantage promised by these Regulations, or to other punishment as the case may require.

**WHARFAGE AND TONNAGE RATES AT  
PUBLIC WHARVES.**

**A**T Twelve o'Clock on Tuesday, the 22nd day of December next, the Colonial Treasurer will put up to Auction, at the Colonial Treasury, Bent-street, Sydney, the Leases for one year, commencing the 1st day of January, 1847, of the Wharfage and Tonnage Rates payable at the undermentioned Public Wharves, under the provisions of the Act of the Governor and Council, 10 Victoria, No. 11, viz. :—

Each Lessee will be entitled to the free use of the Wharf at which he may be authorised to collect Dues, for depositing goods thereon, either for shipment or discharge, as well as for all other purposes appertaining to a Wharf.

The entire use of the large Shed on the Circular Quay will be allowed to the Lessee of the Rates to be received at that Wharf; and the Lessee of those payable at the Old Queen's Wharf will have the use of such Buildings as are upon it.

The use of the Wharves will be reserved as public thoroughfares, or for the landing or embarkation of passengers and other persons at the same free of any charge whatsoever; and the Steps of the Circular Quay will have to be kept free from all warps, hawsers, cables, or goods.

The person or persons who shall be declared to be the highest bidder or bidders, if the bidding be accepted, must immediately enter into a Bond with two sufficient Sureties and Warrant of Attorney, securing regular payment of the rent by equal monthly instalments, before the expiration of seven days after the termination of each month, and containing an engagement binding him or them to a due observance of the Conditions.
