TWENTY POUNDS REWARD OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the morning of the 2nd January last, a man named James Lane, who was employed as a shepherd at a station of Messrs. Cheeke and Broadhurst, in the District of Liverpool Plains, discharged a gun, loaded with shot, at his fellow servant, named Samuel Gledhill, and wounded him in the face, from the effects of which wound the said Samuel Gledhill subsequently died, and that the above mentioned James Lane has absconded, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Twenty Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who shall apprehend the said James Lane and lodge him in any of Her Majesty's Gaols, and if the person apprehending

him be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

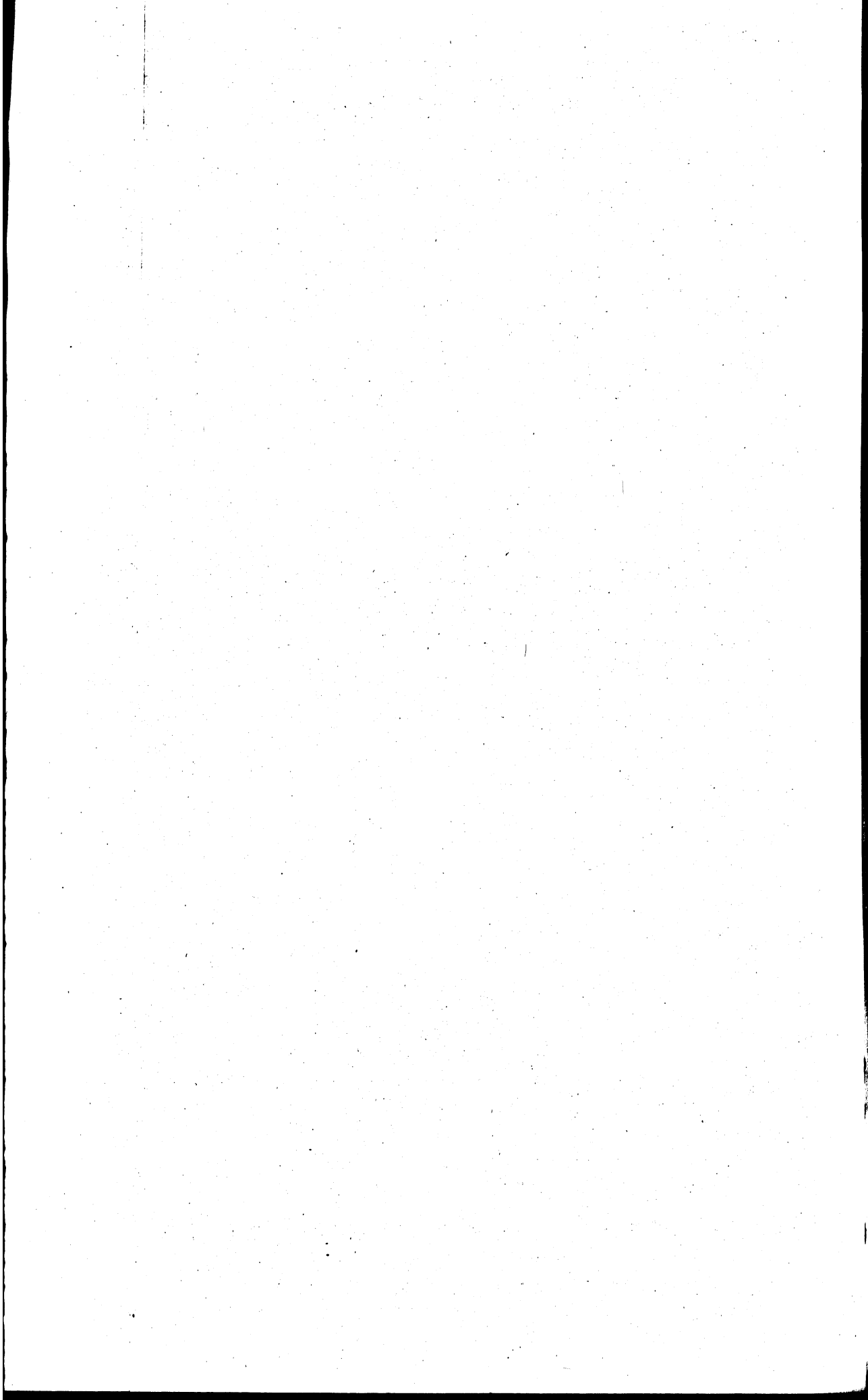
