FORTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH GRANTS.

THE following descriptions of portions of Land which have, from time to time, been appropriated to the purposes of the Roman Catholic Church, as hereunder more particularly mentioned, are published for general information, in order that all parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently, being in addition to the Roman Catholic Church Grants advertised on 1st August, 1845, and on the 9th and 23rd January, 1846.

At the expiration of *one month* from this date, if no caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear, Deeds of Grant of the respective portions will be executed in favor of the approved Trustees in each case, under the provisions of the Act of the Colonial Legislature, 7th William IV. No. 3, viz:—

16. PARRAMATTA, 1a. 3r. 4p., One acre three roods and four perches, County of Cumberland, parish of the Field of Mars, Town of Parramatta; bounded on the north by Pennant-street, bearing east 3 chains 45 links, commencing at the north-east corner of the allotment now granted to George Shelly; on the east by Villiers-street, bearing south 6 degrees west 5 chains and 30 links; on the south by a line bearing west 3 chains 30 links; and on the west by a line bearing north 4 degrees east 5 chains 29 links to the north-east corner of George Shelly's allotment aforesaid.

Authorised as the sites for a Roman Catholic Church and School House, being the land advertised as No. 3 in the Notice of 28th March, 1836.


