WITH a view to prevent the recurrence of the inconvenience which has, in some cases, been found to result from Public Monies having been placed in the Banks by persons in the service of Government to their private accounts; His Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified that, for the future, no Public Monies shall, on any pretence whatever, be paid to the private account of

Officers at the Banks; but that, if transmitted through the Banks at all, they must be carried to a public account, wholly distinct from any private account.
