## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the fourteenth day of April instant: Now, I, Sir George Gipps, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the twelfth day of May next; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim, that a Session of the said Legislative Council shall be holden for the despatch of business, and that the said Council shall accordingly assemble on the aforesaid twelfth day of May next, at Twelve o'clock, at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney, and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this first day of April, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Royal Navy, as may suffice to keep up a constant supply of Provisions on the Island.

Directions for finding the Provisions will be left at the place called "The Post Office", on Booby Island.
