BEACONS ON THE RIVER HUNTER.

Thaving been represented to the Government, that the Beacons placed on the River Hunter for the purpose of pointing out the Channel cut in the lower Flat of the river by the Steam Dredge, have been wilfully carried away, His Excellency the Governor desires to draw the attention of Commanders of Vessels, and others, to the 8th section of the Act of the Colonial Legislature, 3rd William IV. No. 6, under which any person who may remove or wilfully injure or destroy any buoy, beacon, or sea mark used for the convenience of navigation, or for the preservation of vessels, renders himself liable to a penalty of not less than £10, nor more than £50.
