MOUNTED POLICE.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the re-publication of the following Notice relative to the manner in which the Mounted Police is required to act in connection with the Civil Police.

MOUNTED POLICE.

IT having appeared, on different occasions, that the rule is not perfectly understood under which the Mounted Police are required to act in

connection with the Civil Police, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for the information and guidance of the Magistrates and the Officers of the Mounted Police, that, although the Mounted Police are subject to Military discipline, they form a part of the Civil Police of the Colony; and that all Mounted Policemen, when not under the immediate command of one of their Commissioned Officers, are bound to obey the orders of a Civil Magistrate.

The Officers of Mounted Police being Magistrates of the Territory, are, of course, upon an equality in respect to their civil authority with all other Magistrates; they cannot therefore be absolutely called on to execute the orders of any Magistrate or even of a Bench of Magistrates, but it is their duty, as directed in the following extract of the instructions for the Mounted Police, as far as in their power lies, to aid the Magistrates, and to cooperate with them for the Public security.

**EXTRACT FROM THE INSTRUCTIONS
FOR THE MOUNTED POLICE.**

"No. 3. They are at all times to be in readiness, when called on by any Magistrate, to accompany him forthwith to assist in the capture of any bush-rangers or runaways he may receive intelligence of or to act under his orders in quelling any riot or disturbance."

EPISCOPALIAN CHURCH GRANT.

THE description of the following Grant of Land which has been appropriated to the purposes of the United Church of England and Ireland, as hereunder more particularly mentioned, is published for general information, in order that the parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.

At the expiration of one month from this date if no caveat be lodged, or other cause of uncertainty appear, a Deed of Grant of the same will be executed in favor of the Bishop of Australia and his successors.

93. PETERSHAM, 40, Forty acres, County of Cumberland, parish of Petersham; commencing at the Glebe Road at a point 3 chains 55 links south-easterly from the eastern corner of George John Rogers' property, and bounded on the north-west by a line bearing south 47 degrees 45 minutes west 14 chains 90 links to land originally granted to Catherine King; on the south-west by the land originally granted to Catherine King, being a line bearing south 47 degrees 15 minutes east to the old Parramatta Road; on the south-east by the old and present Parramatta Roads; on the east by a curved line extending from the Parramatta Road to the Glebe Road; the said curved line being the segment of a circle having a radius of 106 links from
