PROCLAMATION.

His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by An Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to Courts of Requests, and to extend the Jurisdiction of such Courts in the County of Cumberland," it was among other things enacted, That from and after the first day of January, 1843, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties or Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its dependencies, and at such places respectively as the Governor should, by Proclamation, for that purpose, from time to time appoint: Now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, by the said recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint, that Courts of Requests shall be holden, at the times and places, and for the Districts hereinafter repectively mentioned, that is to say:

At the Town of Mudgee, for the Police District thereof, as described in a certain notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, and published in the New South Wales Government Gazette; and

At Cassilis, for the Police District thereof, as described in a certain notice from the Colonial Secretary's Office, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five:— on the first Mondays and following days respectively

in the months of February, May, August, and November.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this twelfth day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the ninth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

#### TWENTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that a Stack of Wheat, the property of John Hemson, residing at Oswald, near Harper's Hill, in the district of Maitland, was totally consumed by fire, on the night of Friday, the 26th ultimo, and there is reason to believe that the fire was the work of an incendiary; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a reward of Twenty pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the guilty party; and if the person giving the said information be a prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

**T**HE following description of a GRANT OF LAND, with the name of the person to whom it was originally promised, or by whom it is now claimed, is published for general information, in order that all parties concerned may have an opportunity of correcting any errors or omissions that may have been made inadvertently.
