PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GIPPS, Knight,
 Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the
 Territory of New South Wales and its Depen-
 dencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the ninth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "An Act to provide for the General Regulation of the Customs in New South Wales," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, to alter or vary the boundaries of any of the Ports of the Colony, as therein named and defined, or to subdivide the same, and to establish any New Port or Ports as to His Excellency may seem meet, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed necessary to alter the boundaries of the Port of Newcastle, and to establish a Port at Moreton Bay: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me as aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation, hereby declare and direct that, for the purposes of the said recited Act, the Port of Newcastle shall be construed to extend from Bungaree Norah on the south to the thirtieth degree of south latitude on the north, and that the Port of Moreton Bay which shall and is hereby established, shall be construed to extend from the said thirtieth degree of south latitude on the south, to the twenty-sixth degree of south latitude on the north, including

within each such Port all inlets, rivers, bays, and harbours, within the same respectively, and one league to seaward.
