PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Her Majesty has been graciously pleased, by Commission under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the twentieth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and forty-six, to constitute and appoint me,

SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight, to be Captain-General, and Governor-in Chief, in and over the Territory called New South Wales, and its Dependencies: Now I, the Captain-General and Governor aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare, that I have, this day, taken the prescribed Oaths before His Honor Alfred Stephen, Esquire, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the said Territory, and that I have assumed the Administration of the Government accordingly.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare, that Her Majesty has been pleased to nominate and appoint the undermentioned persons to be Members of the Executive Council of the said Territory; that is to say:—

The Senior Officer in command of Her Majesty's Land Forces for the time being.

The Bishop of Australia, or the Bishop of Australia for the time being.

The Colonial Secretary of the said Territory, or the Colonial Secretary of the said Territory for the time being; and

The Colonial Treasurer of the said Territory, or the Colonial Treasurer of the said Territory for the time being.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this third day of August, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the tenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
