PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight, Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to the twenty-fifth day of August instant: Now, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight, Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the eighth day of September next; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim, that the said Council shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid eighth day of September next, at Twelve o'clock, at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney, and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this eleventh day of August, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the tenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

THE following Address was presented to His Excellency the Governor, at Government House, Sydney, on Friday, the 27th instant, viz:—

To His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight, Captain-General, and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY:—

The President and Members of the Standing Committee of the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign parts, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge, established within this Diocese, desire with much sincerity to welcome the arrival of your Excellency at the seat of Government, and to offer their congratulations on your Excellency's assumption of the high office with which Her Most Gracious Majesty has been pleased to invest you. We make this declaration, not with mere formality, nor in words of course, but because, as Members of the United Church of England and Ireland, we are bound by our principles to be loyal and submissive to Her Majesty; and, on Her Majesty's behalf, steadfast supporters of your Excellency as the representative of our Sovereign.

We beg permission to state, in plain and simple language, the objects of our Association, being confident that they will receive the support of your Excellency, as most conducive to the welfare of the community which you are appointed to govern. Those objects are the erection of Churches; the establishment and maintenance of Clergymen, the institution of Schools conducted in conformity with the principles of the Church, and under the superintendence of its Clergy, and the distribution of the Holy Scriptures, with the Liturgy, and other works of a devotional and improving character, in accordance with the doctrines of the Church. We feel assured,

that as the almost incredible destitution of the means of grace and salvation with which this territory is afflicted shall become known to your Excellency, the feelings of a Christian and a Churchman, will incline your Excellency more and more cordially to combine with us in our undertaking, of the design of which we have given a short but faithful account. With deference and respect, we solicit your Excellency's countenance and support; and in order that our endeavours to gather under the pastoral charge of the Church of England the thousands who nominally belong to her may be understood to have the sanction and support of your Excellency, we make it our request that your Excellency will be pleased to accept the office of Patron of the Diocesan Committee.

To the President and Members of the Standing Committee of the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, and for the Promotion of Christian Knowledge, established within the Diocese of Australia.

My Lord Bishop, and Reverend Gentlemen,

I beg you to accept my thanks for your kind congratulations, on my assumption of the high office which Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to commit to my charge.

I beg, at the same time, to express my deep sense of the importance of the objects of your Association, and to assure you, that in accepting the office of Patron of the Diocesan Committee, I shall at all times, be ready to afford my humble assistance in supporting you most cordially in your praiseworthy efforts, to ameliorate the spiritual welfare of this Community.
