We, the undersigned, Clergy, Magistrates, Landed Proprietors, and Residents in the Town and District of Liverpool, beg most respectfully to tender to your Excellency on assuming the Government of this Colony, our sincere congratulations on your safe arrival on our shores, and take this early opportunity of expressing to you, as Her Majesty's representative, our undiminished respect for Her Majesty's person, and unalterable attachment to that constitution, which as British subjects we venerate and feel it our duty ever to uphold.

The selection of your Excellency already experienced in the duties of Government to fill the high Office of Governor-in-Chief of this important Colony and its Dependencies, we cannot but consider as a proof of Her Majesty's desire to promote our interests and advance our prosperity, and therefore beg to assure your Excellency that we highly appreciate the favor conferred upon us.

Trusting that your Excellency may find it convenient to visit our Town and District as soon as the pressing duties which must now occupy your attention will allow, and that thus an early opportunity may be afforded us of expressing more fully our sentiments to your Excellency in person.

**FIFTEEN POUNDS REWARD, OR A
SECOND-CLASS CONDITIONAL PARDON.**

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that on the afternoon of the 10th instant, the Mail was stopped near Black Creek by two armed men, and robbed of the letter bags from Singleton to East and West Maitland and Sydney: His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Fifteen Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the parties guilty of the above outrage; and if the person giving the said information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Second Class Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

TICKET OF LEAVE REGULATIONS.

(TRANSFER OF TICKETS.)

IT appearing to the Governor, that some misapprehension exists with respect to the meaning of the 10th clause of the Ticket of Leave Regulations of the 25th May, 1835, which directs "That all applications for the transfer of a Ticket of Leave from one District to another, or for permission to reside without the bounds of the District for which the Ticket is granted, must be made to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts through the Petty Sessions of the District for which the Ticket already held is granted, or through the nearest Justice, as the case may be;" His Excellency desires it to be explained, that the object of requiring such applications to be transmitted through the Bench of the District was not (as has apparently in some cases been assumed) to enable the Magistrates to regulate the supply of labour in their Districts, but to establish a proper discipline and control over the Convicts, and to prevent such of them as may have laid themselves open to suspicion from changing their Districts, in order to evade a surveillance, which a knowledge of their character may have rendered necessary; whilst it was always intended that well conducted men should select for themselves any of the rural Districts where they thought they were most likely to obtain profitable employment.

When, therefore, applications for the transfer of Tickets of Leave are received, they should be invariably forwarded to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts, for His Excellency's allowance or disallowance; and should the Bench see reason to object to the transfer, the grounds of their objection should be specifically stated in their report.
