Address of the Synod of Australia to His Excellency Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight, Governor of New South Wales, &c., &c.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY :—

WE, the Moderator, Ministers, and Elders of the Synod of Australia, in connexion with the Established Church of Scotland, embrace the opportunity of our Annual Meeting in October, to offer to your Excellency our united congratulations on the arrival of yourself and Lady Mary Fitz Roy on these shores, and to present the assurances of our loyalty to our beloved Sovereign, and our attachment to your Excellency's Person and Government.

Representing a Church which Her Majesty has honored with her support, and whose efficiency is evinced by the many blessings conferred on the people of Scotland, we rely with confidence on your Excellency's protection and aid whilst we are engaged in our labours as spiritual Teachers in this Colony; and we assure your Excellency that it will be our delight, as it is our duty, to inculcate sound principles of religion and virtue.

We fondly hope that under your Excellency's administration, no cause will arise to disturb the peaceful co-operation with the Government of the Colony which we have enjoyed in former years, and which we duly prize and cherish as a powerful means under Providence of diffusing pure and undefiled religion over the length and the breadth of the land.

We fervently pray to Almighty God, that your Excellency and Lady Mary Fitz Roy may enjoy

the blessings of health, and that the period of your Excellency's administration may be characterized as one of peace and prosperity over a loyal and a happy community.

QUIT RENTS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR, with the advice of the Executive Council, directs it to be notified, that the following Regulations have been established for the payment and redemption of Quit-rents due upon Lands under Grants from the Crown, namely:—

1st.—All lands for which twenty years' Quit-rent has been already paid shall be free from further charge; and any persons who may have paid more than twenty years' Quit-rent shall have the difference refunded to them.

2nd.—All persons who have not paid up twenty years' Quit-rent, will be required to do so by yearly instalments of the annual amount due in each case, commencing in this present year; and on the completion of twenty years' payment they will be relieved from all further charge.

3rd.—As an inducement to parties to redeem the Quit-rents due by them according to the terms laid down by this notice, they will be allowed to do so, at any time within twelve months from this date, at the number of years purchase specified in the following scale, namely:—

In any case in, which the land included in a Grant has been subdivided and conveyed in portions to different proprietors, the Government will not object to entertain proposals for the total extinction of the proportionate amount of Quit-rent due on any such portion, on the principle established by this notice; but, as no rule can be laid down which would be generally applicable to cases of this nature, they must form the subject of special investigation and arrangement in each individual case, it being however understood, that any expense of ascertaining the boundaries of the land on which it is desired so to redeem the Quit-rent must be borne by the parties interested.

This arrangement will include all Quit-rents, whether for Town Allotments or Portions of Land; and whether the Grant contain any covenant for redemption or not.
