WHEREAS the Legislative Council of this Colony stands prorogued to Tuesday, the seventeenth day of February instant, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now, therefore, I, Sir George Gipps, Governor of the Colony of New South Wales, do hereby order and proclaim, that the said Legislative Council shall be and the same is accordingly further prorogued to Tuesday, the thirty-first day of March next.

PROCLAMATION.

By his Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales, and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.
