PROCLAMATION:

By His Excellency Sir George Gipps, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the fifth and sixth years of the reign of her most gracious Majesty Queen Victoria; intitled "An Act for the government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land," it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of New South Wales to prorogue the Legislative Council thereof from time to time, and dissolve the same, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient; and whereas it is expedient to prorogue the said Legislative Council for the period hereinafter mentioned: Now, I, Sir George Gipps, Knight, the Governor aforesaid, do hereby, in pursuance of the power and authority so in me vested, prorogue the said Legislative Council from the present date until the twenty-fifth day of August next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this thirteenth day of June, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and in the ninth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Mounted Police.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the re-publication of the following Notice relative to the manner in which the Mounted Police is required to act in connection with the Civil Police.

Mounted Police.

IT having appeared, on different occasions, that the rule is not perfectly understood under which the Mounted Police are required to act in connection with the Civil Police, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for the information and guidance of the Magistrates and the Officers of the Mounted Police, that, although the Mounted Police are subject to Military discipline, they form a part of the Civil Police of the Colony; and that all Mounted Policemen, when not under the immediate command of one of their Commissioned Officers, are bound to obey the orders of a Civil Magistrate.

The Officers of Mounted Police being Magistrates of the Territory, are, of course, upon an equality in respect to their civil authority with all other Magistrates; they cannot therefore be absolutely called on to execute the orders of any Magistrate or even of a Bench of Magistrates, but it is their duty, as directed in the following extract of the instructions for the Mounted Police, as far as their power lies, to aid the Magistrates, and to co-operate with them for the Public security.

Extract from the Instructions for the Mounted Police.

"No. 3. They are at all times to be in readiness, when called on by any Magistrate, to accompany him forthwith to assist in the capture of any bushrangers or runaways he may receive intelligence of, or to act under his orders in quelling any riot or disturbance."
