WHEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to the twenty-fifth day of August instant: Now I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight, Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the eighth day of September next.

and I, do hereby further announce and proclaim, that the said Council shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid eighth day of September next, at twelve o'clock; at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney, and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

No. 1.—The above fares are to and from the shipping, or places specified. A boat to or from William's Town or Melbourne to be paid two shillings and sixpence an hour detention; if to the shipping from either shore, if detained more than a quarter of an hour, to be paid at the rate of one shilling and sixpence per hour.

No. 2.—A blue flag in foul weather will be hoisted at the William's Town signal staff, when the above fares are to be doubled.

No. 3.—Hire of a boat with two men per day; one pound, and ten shillings for each man above that number.

No. 4.—No licensed boatman is to carry more than six persons, under a penalty of not less than five shillings nor more than five pounds.

No. 5.—A boat proceeding to a vessel off the Light House, or in Hobson's River above bar, to be double that to the shipping.

No. 6.—Between the hours of eight at night and six in the morning, the fares are to be double.
