Courts of Requests.

THE following additional Rules of Practice and Proceeding for the conduct of business in the Courts of Requests for the Colony, have been settled by me, with the assistance of Alfred Cheeke, Esq., Commissioner of the Courts of Requests for the County of Cumberland, pursuant to the Act of Council, 6 Victoria, No. 15.

In witness whereof I have hereto set my hand, at Government House, Sydney, this sixth day of January, 1846.

Rules of Practice Repealed.

That the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Rules of Practice be hereby repealed, and the three next following Rules substituted in lieu thereof.

(Ordinary Sittings.)

54. There shall be not more than 12 Sessions in each year, at Sydney, which shall be called the "Ordinary Sittings" of the court, for the trial of all cases not exceeding £10, and the sittings of the Court of Requests for Sydney as well as the sittings for the several Districts in the Colony, shall be at such times and places as his Excellency the Governor, by proclamation, shall, from time to time appoint.

(New-Sittings of the Court.)

55. There shall not be more than six sessions in each year, at Sydney, which shall be called the "new sittings" of the said court, at which sittings, all cases from £10 to £30 shall be tried; and the "new sittings" for Sydney, and for the several Districts in the County of Cumberland, shall be at such times and places as his Excellency the Governor shall, by proclamation, from time to time appoint.

(Time of filing plaint.)

56. In all cases where the claim does not exceed £10, the plaint shall be entered and the summons issuing thereupon be served at least 4 clear days prior to the court day, if in Sydney; if elsewhere such plaint shall be entered, and the summons served at least 6 clear days prior to the sittings of the said court; and in all cases where the claim shall exceed £10, the plaint at Sydney, and elsewhere shall be entered, and the summons served at least 8 clear days prior to the court day.

(Plea of Defendant to constitute a waiver of all irregularity.)

57. That if any Defendant having been served with a summons, shall appear and plead thereto, either in person or by his counsel or attorney, such pleading shall be considered as a waiver of any irregularity whatsoever.

(Any number of defences may be pleaded.)

58. That every Defendant shall be at liberty to file in his defence as many pleas as he shall, in his discretion, think necessary: Provided however, that at the trial of the case he shall be confined in his proof to the matters alone set forth in such plea or pleas.

(Filing pleas or set-off.)

59. That the following additional fee of office be paid by the suiters in the said courts, for filing every plea or set-off, 1s.

(Rule of practice repealed.)

60. That the 37th Rule of Practice be hereby repealed.
