PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act for consolidating and amending the Laws relating to the Licensing of Public Houses, and for further regulating the sale and consumption of Fermented and Spirituous Liquors in New South Wales*," it is amongst other things enacted, that no house for which either a Publican's General License or a Wine and Beer License shall be granted within the Towns of Sydney, Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, and Bathurst, shall have any ingress or egress except in the street or streets named in the License for such house; and that every such License shall become void in case any other passage or entrance than the entrance named in such License shall be used, permitted, or allowed to such house;— and that if the Governor of the said Colony for the time being, shall cause a Proclamation to be published in the "Government Gazette," declaring the 40th section of the said Act to be applicable to any other Town or Towns in New South Wales, or if the Police Magistrate of any Town in the said Colony shall cause a notice under his hand to be delivered to the person licensed, in respect to any house licensed as aforesaid, situated within the limits of any such Town, that the said section of the said Act shall be applicable to the said house, then and in such cases respectively, the Town or Towns to be from time to time mentioned in any

Proclamation or the Licensed House or Houses to be from time to time particularized in any such notice, shall from the expiration of one month from the date of such Proclamation or notice respectively, be subject to the prohibition and penalty therein made applicable to houses licensed as aforesaid within the said Towns of Sydney, Parramatta, Windsor, Maitland, and Bathurst, as fully as if the same had been also expressly included in the said section of the said Act.

Now therefore I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Governor of the said Colony, do, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited law or ordinance, by this my Proclamation, hereby declare, that the provisions of the said 40th section of the said recited Act or Ordinance, shall be extended to and made applicable to the Town of Melbourne in the District of Port Phillip; and that at the expiration of one month from the day of the date hereof, the said 40th section of the said recited Act will become applicable to the Town of Melbourne accordingly.

**REWARD OF A CONDITIONAL PARDON.**

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to the Government that on the 14th ultimo, an armed Bushranger stole from the overseer of W. C. Wentworth, Esquire, a Brown Pony, Saddle, and Bridle, and afterwards robbed his Head Station on the Namoy River, called Barbargate; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that if any Prisoner of the Crown shall give such information as may lead to the conviction of the offender, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

WHEREAS an armed Bushranger, on the 14th ultimo, stole a Brown Pony, about 14 hands high, with long tail, black points, and a star in the forehead, branded on the near shoulder TR conjoined, and on the off shoulder N, together with a Saddle and Bridle; and afterwards robbed my Head Station on the Namoy River, called Barbargate, of a quantity of Tea, Sugar, Tobacco, Spirits, Clothes, and other articles of the value of more than £30: A Reward of £20 is hereby offered to any person or persons who shall give such information as may lead to the conviction of the offender; and a further Reward of £2 is offered to any one who shall deliver up the said Pony to my Superintendent, Mr. John Christie, or to any person in charge of any of my Stations on the Namoy, or elsewhere.



On the 4th June, 1828, Governor Darling refused to authorise his receiving the land, unless he settled, and he was referred to the Land Board. In July, 1834, he renewed his selection which was refused. He is now deceased, and his heirs have empowered their Attorney to select the land.*
