PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS
FITZ Rov, Knight Companion of the
Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order,
Captain-General and Governor-inChief of the Territory of New South
Wales and its Dependencies, and ViceAdmiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, " An Act to con-" solidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of " Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such " Courts in the County of Cumberland," and again amended by an Act passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her said Majesty, intituled, "An Act " to amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests, "in the City of Sydney, and County of Cum-berland, and in the town of Melbourne and "County of Bourke respectively" it was in the said first recited Act, amongst other things enacted, that from and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, Courts of Requests should be holden in and for such Counties and Districts, or other portions of this Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places respectively, as the Governor should by Proclamation for that purpose from time to time appoint; and whereas by the last recited Act it was enacted, that all Courts of Requests established or to be established within the City of Sydney, and County of Cumberland, and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, should respectively have power and authority to hear and determine, in a summary way, all actions whatsoever for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage,

whether liquidated or unliquidated, to an amount not exceeding thirty pounds; now I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me, by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct and appoint, that Courts of Requests in and for the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, shall be holden during the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, at the Town of Melbourne, at the times hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

The Ordinary Sittings of the Court of Requests for the Town of Melbourne, and County of Bourke, for the trial of all cases not exceeding ten pounds, shall be holden on the following days respectively, viz.:—Monday, 3rd January; Monday, 7th February; Monday, 6th March; Monday, 3rd April; Monday, 1st May; Monday, 5th June; Monday, 3rd July; Monday, 7th August; Monday, 4th September; Monday, 2nd October; Monday, 6th November; Monday, 4th December.

The new Sittings of the said Court for the trial of all cases from ten to thirty pounds, shall be holden on the following days respectively, viz.:—Thursday, 10th February; Thursday, 6th April; Thursday, 8th June; Thursday, 3rd August; Thursday, 5th October; Thursday, 7th December.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the Accounts of the year within which it was received.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers, who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month

after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.

REPAIR OF THE ROAD BETWEEN BATHURST AND WELLINGTON.

TENDERS will be received by the Warden of the District Council of Bathurst from persons willing to contract for effecting the following repairs on the road between Bathurst and Wellington:—

Firstly—To make a ford at Evans Plains Creek; a strong beam to be fixed across the Creek, both ends seamed in the banks, large stones placed on the upper side, and small stones for the drays to pass over, and the banks cut in a sloping direction. A bridge to be erected over a small creek at Mary's Lane; a beam to be placed on each side of the creek bedded in the side from the edge of the creek; sleepers to be placed across the creek and then slabbed over; the whole to be pinned down; the timber to be strong and durable; the bridge to be gravelled over.

At the Rocks large stones to be removed, holes to be filled up, cuts to be made to turn the water off the road, the road to be levelled, a strong rail placed on each side of the bridge at the bottom of the hill near the public-house.

The road near Neil's water holes to be repaired by levelling; the ruts to be filled up and cuts to be made to turn the water off the road.

A small drain near McCabe's house, to be filled up with stones, for the safe passage of drays.

A bridge to be erected over a creek on the east side of Guyong Swamp; strong beam to be placed on each side of the creek, to receive sleepers, then to be slabbed over and gravelled; a drain to be cut on the upper side of the road, about sixty rods, two feet wide at the top, one foot deep, and one foot wide at the bottom; the road approaching the bridge to be well gravelled.

A bridge to be erected over the creek, on the west side of Guyong Swamp, in the same manner and form as bridge on the east side, but the drain or cut will only require to be about thirty rods in length.

Secondly—The ford over the head of Frederick's Valley Creek, on the east side of Kaines Dairy to be repaired by placing a few cart loads of stone, and levelling.

A small bridge to be built over the creek, on the west side of Kaines Dairy, strong beam to be placed on each side of the creek; sleepers placed on them and then to be well slabbed and gravelled; the timber to be sound and durable; a small cut of a few yards in length, to be made to keep the road dry.

A small bridge over the creek between the last creek and McKillop's, to be erected in the same manner and form as the last but drains required. A little to the west of last creek a drain to be filled with stones.

Three bridges to be built over the Summerhill Creek and its branches near McKillop's; the bridges to be erected with strong and durable beams, sleepers, and slabs, and to be well gravelled, strong side rails on each bridge; the road for about eighty rods to be gravelled 16½ feet wide, and 12 inches thick, in the centre; the road to taper down on each side.

About half a mile to the west of the bridges; a drain to be filled up with stones.
