PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, the Crown Lands of this Territory, adjacent to, and beyond the limits allotted for location, were divided into nine Districts, comprised within certain limits therein set forth; and whereas it is expedient that the District therein designated the "*Liverpool Plains District*" be divided into two districts, and that the boundaries of the District therein designated the "*Bligh District*," be altered so as to conform to the boundaries of the District of *Liverpool Plains* as hereinafter defined: Now, therefore, I, SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, the Governor aforesaid, in virtue of the authority in me vested, do hereby proclaim, that the beforementioned District of *Liverpool Plains* shall be, and is hereby divided into two Districts, to be called respectively the *Liverpool Plains District*, and the *Gwyder District*, and that the following shall be the boundaries of the same, and of the *Bligh District* respectively, that is to say:—

Liverpool Plains District.—Bounded on the east by the River Mooni downwards to its confluence with the River Barwan, and by that river to Pockataroo; on the north-east by the range dividing the valley of the River Gwyder from the valley of the Thalaba Creek, and that of the River Namoi or Peel and its sources to the boundary of the New England District; on the east by part of the New

England District; on the south-west by the Liverpool and Warrabangle Ranges, by the range bounding the valley of the River Castlereagh, and by the River Barwan, which divides this from the Bligh and Wellington Districts; on the west and north the boundaries remain undefined.

Gwyder District.—Bounded on the west by the River Mooni downwards to its confluence with the River Barwan, and by the Barwan to Pockataroo; on the south-west by the range dividing the valley of the River Gwyder from the valley of the Thalaba Creek, and of the River Namoi or Peel and its sources to the boundary of the New England District; on the east by part of the New England District, and by part of the Darling Downs District; and on the north by that District.

Bligh District.—Bounded on the south-west by the River Macquarie, which separates this District from the Wellington District; on the south-east by the County of Bligh; on the north-east by the Warrabangle Range and by the range bounding the valley of the River Castlereagh; and on the north by the River Barwan.

And whereas it is further expedient that the Crown Lands comprised within the limits next following be erected into a separate District, and that the boundaries of the District designated in the beforementioned Proclamation the "*Wellington District*," be altered so as to conform to the boundaries of the last mentioned District: Now, I, the Governor aforesaid, do hereby further proclaim, that the Crown Lands comprised within the limits next following, shall be, and they are hereby erected into a separate District, to be called the "*Lower Darling District*," and that the following shall be the boundaries of the same, and of the "*Wellington District*" respectively, that is to say:—

Lower Darling District.—Bounded on the north-east by a line extending north-westerly from the con-

fluence of the Kalingalungaguy Creek with the River Lachlan to Fort Bourke; on the north-west by the River Darling; on the south by the Rivers Murray and Murrumbidgee; and on the south-east by the River Lachlan.

Wellington District.—Bounded on the north-east by the River Macquarie; on the east by the Counties of Wellington and Bathurst; on the south by the River Lachlan; on the south-west by a line extending from the confluence of the Kalingalungaguy Creek with the River Lachlan to Fort Bourke; and on the north by the River Barwan.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Parramatta, this fourth day of December, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.

MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT OF THE LUNATIC ASYLUM.

HAVING been directed by His Excellency the Governor to recommend a fit person to be appointed the Superintendent of the Lunatic Asylum at Tarban Creek, I hereby invite such persons as may be desirous of becoming candidates for the appointment, to send to me, (addressed as below,) before Monday, the 13th December next, their applications for it, with such testimonials of qualification as they may wish to produce.

It is indispensable that the applicant be a legally qualified Medical Practitioner in New South Wales; that he shall have practised the three branches of the Medical profession, viz., Medicine, Surgery, and Midwifery, during at least, the last five years; and that he should thoroughly understand the dispensing of medicine, and otherwise have received a good general education; and it is desirable that he be a married man, above thirty years of age, in sound health, of good moral character, and free from infirmities of temper.

The Salary voted by the Honorable the Legislative Council for the Medical Superintendent, is (£400) four hundred pounds per annum, with a residence, light, fuel, and provisions; if the candidate have a family, he should state for how many he will require accommodation.

He should, if possible, be in Sydney on the 13th December, to reply to any questions it may be thought necessary to ask, and should be prepared to commence his duties on the 1st January, 1848, or as soon after as may be required.
