#### RE-FORMATION AND METALLING OF A PORTION OF ROAD NEAR WINDSOR, AND REPAIR OF A CROSS DRAIN THEREON.

**T**ENDERS will be received at this Office until Twelve o'clock of Monday, the 11th January, for Re-forming and Metalling that portion of the Windsor Road passing M<sup>r</sup> Grath's Hill, between the Pitt Town Road, and the first metalled cause-way entering Windsor, and for repairing a Cross Drain near the thirty-third mile stone on the same road, to be endorsed "Tender for Windsor Road."
