CHURCH AND SCHOOL ESTATES.

LEASES FOR SEVEN, FOURTEEN, AND TWENTY-ONE YEARS.

ON Monday, the 29th March next, the following Lands, belonging to the Church and School Estates, will be put up to Public Auction, at the rear of the Colonial Treasury, at Twelve o'clock precisely.

The following is the Plan upon which these Lands will be offered to public competition :—

A lease will be granted for twenty-one years, the tenant having the option to determine it at the expiration of the first or second term of seven years. The rental of the second and third terms will be successively increased by half the amount of the annual rental of the first term, viz., in the following ratio, 4, 6, 8.

The lease will not contain any clause to prevent underletting, but the under-tenants will in no way be recognised by the Government, and the original lessee, unless a transfer be formally executed by the Agent, will be held responsible for the due payment of the rent.

The usual reservations as to making roads, constructing bridges, &c., will be introduced, but the reservation will not extend to timber, which the tenant will be allowed to cut.

The rent for the first year must be paid on the day of sale, after which period, the rent will be payable in advance, yearly, when the annual rent is below thirty pounds, and half-yearly, when the rent is not less than that sum.
