PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to the twentieth day of April next: Now, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby further prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the fourth day of May next; and I do hereby further announce and proclaim, that the said Council shall assemble for the despatch of business on the aforesaid fourth day of May next, at twelve o'clock at noon, in the Council Chamber, situate in Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydney; and the Members of the said Legislative Council are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this twenty-ninth day of March, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the tenth year of Her Majesty's reign.
