(Sittings in Banco in Vacation.)

1. After the third day of May next, the Court will sit *in Banco* on every Wednesday in Vacation, on which there shall be a sitting of the Court in its Insolvency Jurisdiction, for the purpose of hearing and disposing of motions for Juries of twelve persons, and motions against the Casual Ejector in actions of ejectment.

(Execution for Costs in Ejectment, Prac. 236.)

2. In all cases of Ejectment, hereafter tried, the party succeeding (whether Plaintiff or Defendant) may obtain an order for speedy execution for his costs, under the Rule in that behalf of the 31st day of August, 1843, and may issue execution for the same, (subject to the right of the adverse party, to pay the amount into Court, as by the next following Rule of that date is provided,) upon a recital in the Writ of the Judge's Order, and without proceeding to Judgment.
