PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, in the ninth and tenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to amend an Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies, and to make further provision for the management thereof*;" it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall take effect, and have the force of Law in each of the Colonies of *New South Wales, South Australia, and Western Australia*, from and after a day to be specified by the Governor of each of such Colonies, in some Proclamation to be issued by him for that purpose, Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor of New South Wales aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation by me issued for that purpose, hereby specify and proclaim, the first day of May, now next ensuing, as the day from and after which the said Act shall

take effect and have the force of Law within the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Parramatta, this twenty-second day of April, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the tenth year of Her Majesty's reign.
