#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act passed by the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, in the ninth and tenth years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to amend an " Act for regulating the sale of Waste Land " belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colo-"" nies,' and to make further provision for the mun"agement thereof," it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall take effect, and have the force of Law in each of the Colonics of New South Wales, South Australia, and Western Australia, from and after a day to be specified by the Governor of each of such Colonies, in some Proclamation to be issued by him for that purpose, Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Governor of New South Wales aforesaid, do, by this my Proclamation by me issued for that purpose, hereby specify and proclaim, the first day of May, now next ensuing, as the day from and after which the said Act shall "and amend the Laws for the Distillation of Spirits

take effect and have the force of Law within the Colony of New South Wales and its Dependencies.
