PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Legislative Council of New South Wales now stands prorogued to Tuesday, the 26th day of January instant, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as Governor of the said Colony, do hereby prorogue the said Legislative Council to Tuesday, the ninth day of March next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Government House, Sydney, this eleventh day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the tenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

LAND AND IMMIGRATION DEBENTURES.

WITH reference to the Government Notice of 26th February, 1844, His Excellency the Governor directs that the holders of the Land and Immigration Debentures payable in the Colony, be reminded, that at the expiration of three years from the day on which they were respectively issued they become payable at the Colonial Treasury in Sydney; and that from and after that date they will cease to bear interest.

With respect to the Debentures payable in England, His Excellency directs it also to be notified, that a remittance has been made to the Colonial Agent General in London, to enable him to pay off such as have been transmitted thither, with the interest due thereon, at the expiration of three years from the date on which they were respectively issued.

In like manner such of the latter Debentures as still remain in the Colony will be paid off if presented at the Colonial Treasury at the same period; after which they will, of course, cease to bear interest.

REWARD OF A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government that on the 14th ultimo, an armed Bushranger stole from the overseer of W. C. Wentworth, Esquire, a Brown Pony, Saddle, and Bridle, and afterwards robbed his Head Station on the Namoy River, called Barbargate; His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that if any Prisoner of the Crown shall give such information as may lead to the conviction of the offender, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.

WHEREAS an armed Bushranger, on the 14th ultimo, stole a Brown Pony, about 14 hands high, with long tail, black points, and a star in the forehead, branded on the near shoulder TR conjoined, and on the off shoulder N, together with a Saddle and Bridle; and afterwards robbed my Head Station on the Namoy River, called Barbargate, of a quantity of Tea, Sugar, Tobacco, Spirits, Clothes, and other articles of the value of more than £30: A Reward of £20 is hereby offered to any person or persons who shall give such information as may lead to the conviction of the offender; and a further Reward of £2 is offered to any one who shall deliver up the said Pony to my Superintendent, Mr. John Christie, or to any person in charge of any of my Stations on the Namoy, or elsewhere.

**TWENTY POUNDS REWARD, OR A
CONDITIONAL PARDON.**

VACCINATION.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that a Vaccine Institution has been established in Sydney, and that Dr. Savage, the Health Officer, has been appointed to carry out the objects of the Institution.

His Excellency further directs it to be notified, that Dr. Savage will be in attendance at the Immigration Barracks, Bent-street, between the hours of 10 and 12 o'Clock on every Tuesday and Saturday to Vaccinate, free of charge, such children as may be taken to him for the purpose. But as the operation itself, without any proof of its having taken effect, would be insufficient security to the public mind, His Excellency has been pleased to direct, that the sum of one shilling shall be deposited for every child vaccinated, which sum will be returned on the presentation of the child on the next vaccination day.

His Excellency very strongly recommends Parents and Guardians to avail themselves of the means thus afforded to them of taking this necessary and proper precaution with respect to all children not already vaccinated.

In order that a constant supply may be kept up throughout the Colony, the Health Officer will furnish lymph to any Medical Practitioners in the Country Districts who may apply for the same.

All communications with that Officer on the subject of Vaccination, sent through the Post Office, must be enclosed under cover to the Colonial Secretary, with the word "Vaccination" on the lower left hand corner of the envelope.
