ATTENDANCE OF WITNESSES IN CRIMINAL CASES.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the publication of the following Circular Letter, addressed to the Police Benches throughout the Colony, relative to the mode of procuring the attendance of Witnesses at the Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court, and the several Courts of Quarter Sessions.

GENTLEMEN,

I am directed by His Excellency the Governor to inform you, that, with a view to obviate the inconvenience incident to the present system of serving Subpoenas on Witnesses to attend at the Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court, and at the several Courts of Quarter Sessions, it has been determined to assimilate the practice in this Colony to that followed in England, where parties are committed for Trial at particular Courts, and the Witnesses bound over to appear at stated times and places, to give evidence.

In order to carry out this intention, I have the honor to request, that from and after the first day of July next, in future committals before your Bench, you will be so good as to bind over all material Witnesses absolutely to appear on the first day of the next Session of the Supreme Court, Circuit Court, or Court of Quarter Sessions, (as the case may be) and thence to attend from day to day until duly discharged,

without any further notice by Subpœna or otherwise—giving, however, at the same time, a written Memorandum, to each Witness, of the time, the particular Court, and the place at which he will be required to attend, in order to prevent any misconception of these particulars.

I annex a form of Recognizance and Memorandum to be in future used by you.

All committals for capital offences, and for perjury and forgery, and offences against the Insolvent Laws, must be to the Supreme Court, either at Sydney or on Circuit, according to the circumstances of time, place, and expense; and it will be proper that cases involving charges of very heinous offences, or presenting peculiar difficulties of Law or of fact, should be also sent to the Superior Courts, unless, in order to avoid greater delay or expense, or the better to secure the attendance of Witnesses, or on any other ground, you deem it expedient and more conducive to the public interests, or just towards the party accused, that the Trial should take place at a Court of Quarter Sessions, in all which cases your reasons should be communicated to Her Majesty's Attorney General.

The depositions should be transmitted as usual, to the Attorney General's office; but in cases of committal for trial at a Circuit Court, or a country Court of Quarter Sessions, which may be too near at hand to afford sufficient time for the purpose, you will please to cause them to be addressed to the Attorney or Solicitor General, at the place of holding the Circuit Court, or to the Crown Prosecutor or Clerk of the Peace, at the place of holding the Quarter Sessions; and at the same time to transmit to the Attorney General's Office, at Sydney, a Memorandum, setting forth the names and description of the parties committed, the nature of the charge, and the date of committal, and stating to what Officer, and to what place, the depositions have been sent.

The attention of His Excellency has been directed to the question of how far the discretionary power extends, which Justices possess, of receiving the depositions of Witnesses, tendered before committal, by a party accused of crime, and I am to invite your perusal of the annexed extract from a valuable legal work, entitled, "Russell on Crimes," 3rd edition, vol. 2, page 900, and to recommend the views there propounded, but without dictating the adoption of them, or even advising that they should be indiscriminately followed in all cases and under all circumstances.

"It is highly expedient to the furtherance of the ends of justice, that whenever prisoners offer to produce witnesses before the Magistrate, in answer to the charge made against them, such witnesses should be regularly examined on oath, and their statements taken down in writing, and returned with the depositions; whether the evidence so produced be true or false, it is very important that it should be received and taken down; if it be true, it may be so clear, positive and distinct, as to explain or contradict the evidence adduced in support of the charge, in such a manner as completely to satisfy the Magistrates that there is no sufficient ground for judicial enquiry into the guilt of the party charged; in which case he ought to be discharged; or the evidence adduced on behalf of the party charged may, in the opinion of the Magistrates, weaken the presump-

"tion of the party's guilt; but there may, notwithstanding, appear to them, to be sufficient ground for judicial enquiry into the party's guilt; in which case the Magistrates should admit the prisoner to bail. And even if the evidence so adduced should not produce either of these results, still it is important for the sake of the prisoner, that his witnesses should be examined and their depositions returned, as he is thereby freed from the suggestion often made at the trial, that the case endeavoured to be proved before the Jury has been concocted since the examination before the Magistrate; and if (as has been suggested) the deposition of a Witness examined on behalf of a prisoner before the Magistrate, would be admissible in evidence for the prisoner on his trial, in case of the death of such Witness, it is but reasonable that the prisoner should have the depositions of his Witnesses taken, in order to be used in case of such an event. On the other hand, if the evidence adduced be false, it is essential for the ends of justice that it should be heard and taken down, in order that the Prosecutor may have the means before the trial of investigating the facts deposed to, and the opportunity of testing the statements of the Witnesses, by comparing those made on the trial with those made before the Magistrate; and moreover the taking the depositions would serve as a check upon the prisoner, against setting up a different defence on the trial, and upon the Witnesses against improving their tale, between the time of their examination before the Magistrate and the trial."

It is conceived that with these few instructions, and a reference to the Proclamations by which the Criminal Sittings, and Circuits of the Supreme Courts, and Courts of Quarter Sessions, are appointed to be held, or to the "Sydney Law Calendar and Almanac," (of which you will be annually furnished with a copy,) you will have little difficulty in determining either what offences should be sent for trial to the respective Courts, or the proper time and place at which to require the attendance of Witnesses.

Should however any alteration require to be made in these respects, after a case shall have been committed by you, to any particular Court, it will still be competent to the Attorney General to rectify the same, giving due notice of the alteration to the parties concerned.

DEPASTURING LICENSES AND ASSESSMENT ON STOCK.

CONSIDERABLE sums being still due to the
Government for Depasturing Licenses, and
for arrears of Assessment on Stock pastured on Crown
Lands beyond the boundaries of location, His
Excellency the Governor directs it to be intimated
to all persons thus in default, that unless they forth-
with pay up all arrears and take out Licenses for the
runs they occupy, the Government will be reluct-
antly compelled to proceed for penalties, and to dis-
possess them, under the Act of Parliament 9 and
10 Victoria, cap. 101.

And all parties thus in arrear are reminded, that
under the proposed Order in Council, the licensed
occupants of Crown Lands, at the time the same
may come into effect, will alone be entitled to de-

mand or obtain without competition leases of their
runs.

tions in question, deems it necessary to announce,
for general information, that he cannot undertake to
place upon the Estimates any addition to the Expen-
diture for Schools of this description, beyond the
amount for the whole of the present year, calculated
in proportion to the payments for the first quarter of
the same.
