PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act to amend an Act, intituled 'An Act to repeal an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, intituled 'An Act to authorise the erection of Pounds, and for regulating the Impounding of Cattle,' and to make further and other provisions in lieu thereof, and to extend the provisions thereof,'*" it was, amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor, or acting Governor, for the time being, should deem it expedient and advantageous to extend the provisions of the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, so far as the same relate to any person suffering any cattle belonging to him, or in his charge, to stray or go about, or to be tethered or depastured in any street or public place within the limits, or reputed limits, of the several Towns in the said Act mentioned, to such other Towns now erected, or hereafter to be erected or established at any place within the said Colony as might thereafter be deemed necessary, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor, or

acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation, to be published in the *Government Gazette*: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, by this my Proclamation do hereby direct, that so much of the provisions of the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, as is hereinbefore particularly specified, be extended to the Town of Wollongong, in the County of Camden.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, in conformity with the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, passed in the

fourth year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "*An Act to provide for the making and repairing of Parish Roads in the Colony of New South Wales*," Trustees have been appointed for a road known as the Parish Road leading from the Suburban Allotments in the Parish of Jika Jika, near Melbourne, to the Village Reserve in the Parish of Nillumbik, River Plenty; and the said Trustees have, in accordance with the twenty-first section of such Act, certified that the said Parish Road is in a state to permit and allow the safe and uninterrupted passage of the public with their carriages and other vehicles and horses, and other cattle and stock; and it has further been made to appear, to the satisfaction of the Governor and Executive Council, that a sum exceeding three hundred and fifty pounds sterling has been expended thereon: Now, therefore, I, Sir Charles Augustus Fitz Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, the Governor of New South Wales aforesaid, in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the said recited Act, do, by this my Proclamation, appoint and direct Tolls to be demanded, levied, and taken upon the aforesaid Parish Road, leading from the Suburban Allotments in the Parish of Jika Jika, near Melbourne, to the Village Reserve in the Parish of Nillumbik, River Plenty, in the manner prescribed by the before recited Act, and at the rates specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed; and further, that the Tolls so to be collected or levied upon such Parish Road, shall be paid to the Trustees thereof, to be by them laid out, employed, and expended in the making, fencing, and repairing, and in keeping in repair the said road and the bridges thereon, and in keeping in proper repair the toll houses and bars, and in the payment of the Collector of such Toll, and other necessary expenses, of which all parties concerned are hereby required to take due notice.

For every coach, chariot, chaise, waggon, or other carriage with four wheels, usually drawn by two or more horses, affixed, tied, or secured to waggons, carts, or other carriages, there shall be paid the same rate of Toll as would be paid for such coach, chariot, chaise, waggon, or other carriage, if drawn by two horses, or other animals; and for every dray, cart, or other carriage with two wheels, the same rate of Toll as if drawn by one horse: Provided always, that if any coach, chariot, cart, or other carriage, so tied or affixed to any waggon, dray, or cart, shall have any goods conveyed therein, other than the harness thereto belonging, and such arti- cles of package as may be necessary for the protection of such carriage, or any passenger, the same shall be liable to double the Toll hereby imposed; the above rates of Toll shall be doubled on each and every Sunday.

REWARD OF TEN POUNDS, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

REPAIRS TO THE LIVERPOOL AND CAMPBELLTOWN ROAD.

1. Thoroughly repairing fourteen small bridges and seventeen cross drains, between the Cross Roads at Harris' and Narrellan, via Campbelltown.
2. Removing two platform bridges between Liverpool and Cross Road at Harris', and laying Corduroy Bridges in their stead, 60 and 40 yards long, and 30 feet wide.
