#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES AUGUSTUS FITZ Roy, Knight Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Territory of New South Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Act or Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend an "Act, intituled 'An Act to repeal an Act of the " Governor and Council of New South Wates, " intituled 'An Act to authorise the erection of " . Pounds, and for regulating the Impounding " ' of Cattle,' and to make further and other pro-" 'visions in lieu thereof,' and to extend the pro" 'visions thereof,' " it was, amongst other things enacted, that whenever the Governor, or acting Governor, for the time being, should deem it expedient and advantageous to extend the provisions of the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, so far as the same relate to any person suffering any cattle belonging to him, or in his charge, to stray or go about, or to be tethered or depastured in any street or public place within the limits, or reputed limits, of the several Towns in the said Act mentioned, to such other Towns now erected, or hereafter to be erected or established at any place within the said Colony as might thereafter be deemed necessary, it should and might be lawful for the said Governor, or

acting Governor for the time being, to declare the same by Proclamation, to be published in the Government Gazette: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in me by the said recited Act, by this my Proclamation do hereby direct, that so much of the provisions of the said Act, passed in the fourth year of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, as is hereinbefore particularly specified, be extended to the Town of Wollongong, in the County of Camden.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Sydney, this fifth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, and in the eleventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

One brindle steer, star in forehead, white belly, tail, and

hind legs, piece out of the off ear, branded like MS off rump.

One brindle and white poley cow, aged, branded NxC near ribs, JN off rump, J and a blotched letter after it off thigh, like 8 or B off ribs, apparently ON off shoulder, a brindle and white poley steer by her side, tip off the off ear, branded like 3N off rump, a brand off ribs not legible.
