REGULA GENERALIS.

GOULBURN AND BERRIMA CIRCUITS.

WHEREAS His Excellency the Governor has, by his Proclamation bearing date the 20th day of April last, appointed that Circuit Courts shall hereafter be holden at Goulburn as well as at Berrima, in this Colony; and the next Circuit Court to be holden at Berrima, is to be on Wednesday, the 1st day of September next; and at Goulburn, is to be on Saturday, the 4th day of the same month: And whereas by another Proclamation, issued by His Excellency, bearing date the 14th day of June last, the Berrima Circuit District is appointed to comprise the County of Camden, and the Goulburn Circuit District is to comprise the Counties of Argyle and St. Vincent, (except a certain portion of the last mentioned County,) and the Counties of King and Murray: And whereas no provision hath as yet been made by the Judges in respect of the trial of Civil Causes at the said Circuit Town of Goulburn, it is hereby ordered as follows, that is to say—

First.—The days for trying causes in the said Circuit Courts, shall be the following, namely:—At Berrima, the second day of the Sittings; and at Goulburn, the fifth day of the Sittings, or so soon after, respectively, as the presiding Judge shall direct.

Secondly.—After the date of these Rules, *Berrima* shall be a sufficient venue in respect of all causes of action arising within the County of Camden; and *Goulburn* shall be a sufficient venue in respect of all causes of action arising within any of the said other Counties, (including the whole of the said County of St. Vincent,) or in or at any district or place lying south of the same Counties or any of them: Provided that where part of the subject matter of an action shall have arisen within the said Goulburn District, and part within the County of Camden, either of the said Towns shall be a sufficient venue.

Thirdly.—Provided, nevertheless, that in respect of all actions, the subject matter of which shall have arisen to the southward of the County of Cumberland, the Court or any Judge shall have power to direct the venue to be laid, (and the cause to be accordingly tried,) either at *Berrima* or at *Goulburn*, as shall seem under the circumstances of the case to be most fitting.

Saturdays in Term.

1. The Court will, in future, sit on every Saturday in Term, at Eleven o'clock, for the hearing of further arguments in any matter then un concluded and standing for further argument.

Equity Appeal Days.

2. So soon as the Equity Appeals shall have been disposed of, or whenever on any of the days appointed for them, there shall be none ready for hearing, the Court will proceed with the other ordinary Term business.

Special Banco Sittings.

3. All Causes for trial during the next Sittings for Causes, shall be set down consecutively only; and on every day in the *third week* of those Sittings, on which there shall be no Cause for trial, the Court will sit *in banco* for the disposal of new trial motions.

Days for Assessment.

4. The ninth of the General Rules made on the fourth day of November, 1846, shall be amended by substituting for the words "Wednesday or Friday," the words "Monday or Thursday:" Provided that this alteration shall not take effect, in respect of any writ or notice already issued or given, or that shall be issued or given, before the eleventh day of July instant.
