REWARD OF TEN POUNDS, OR A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government, that during the night of the 18th or morning of the 19th instant, a mare, the property of the Chief Constable at Dungog, was stabbed in the abdomen, by some evil disposed person or persons unknown, with a knife or some sharp instrument, in consequence of which she died : His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that a Reward of Ten Pounds will be paid to any free person or persons who may give such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the guilty party or parties; and further that if the party giving such information be a Prisoner of the Crown, application will be made to Her Majesty for the allowance of a Conditional Pardon to such Prisoner of the Crown.
