GROSE FARM.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that the Paddocks at Grose Farm, will be put up separately to Auction, for Sale on Lease or License, for one year, commencing 1st August next, at the Colonial Treasury, Sydney, at Eleven o'clock, on Wednesday, the 21st of July, namely:—

Lot 1.—Is estimated to contain eighteen acres, and comprises two paddocks, fenced, with the old Stockade and the garden and yard attached thereto, and is situate on the north-western end of Grose Farm, but excludes the Police Station at the western extremity. Upset price £30

Lot 2.—Estimated to contain twenty-two and a-half acres, comprises two paddocks fenced, and is situated on the south-west corner of the farm. Upset price £15.

Lot 3.—Estimated to contain twenty-six and a-half acres, comprises two paddocks fenced; it is bounded by a fence dividing it from lots 2, 4, & 5. Upset price £18.
