REWARD OF A CONDITIONAL PARDON.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Government that on the 14th ultimo, an armed Bushranger stole from the overseer of W. C. In pursuance of a Report under the first Commission on Memorial No. 767, a Deed of Grant of the land above described, was prepared in favor of Richard Macquiness, dated 20th May, 1837; but he having died in November, 1836, the deed is void. Macquiness, before his death, sold to Charles Robins, under whom Claimant derives his title, and requests a Deed of Grant from the Crown.

Case No. 1263.—James McMeekan, Alexander McMeekan, and Margaret Kelling, at present residing in Scotland, by their Attorney Robert Crawford, of Hillend, gentleman.
Eight hundred acres to be selected.

On the 29th July, 1824, Sir Thomas Brisbane issued an order in favor of William McMeekan, for 800 acres of land, of which he made unsatisfactory selections. On the 4th June, 1828, Governor Darling refused to authorise his re-

ceiving the land, unless he settled, and he was referred to the Land Board. In July, 1834, he renewed his selection which was refused. He is now deceased, and his heirs have empowered their Attorney to select the land.

One black heifer, little white on rump, branded RD ; damages 2s. each.

One red sided bullock, white back, speckled head, branded on the off hip and ribs like W8.

One red and white bullock, both ears marked, branded on the off ribs JII, shoulder JII ; damages 5s. each.

One red sided bullock, white back, appears to be a worker, branded on the near hip apparently JB or Q-C conjoined.
