PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir CHARLES AUGUSTUS
FITZ ROY, Knight Companion of the
Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order,
Captain-General and Governor-in-
Chief of the Territory of New South
Wales and its Dependencies, and Vice-
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and
Legislative Council of New South Wales,
passed in the sixth year of the reign of Her present
Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, "*An Act to con-
solidate and amend the laws relating to Courts of
Requests, and to extend the jurisdiction of such
Courts in the County of Cumberland,*" and again
amended by an Act passed in the eleventh year of
the reign of Her said Majesty, intituled, "*An Act
to amend the laws relating to Courts of Requests,
in the City of Sydney, and County of Cum-
berland, and in the town of Melbourne and
County of Bourke respectively*" it was in the
said first recited Act, amongst other things enacted,
that from and after the first day of January, one
thousand eight hundred and forty-three, Courts
of Requests should be holden in and for such
Counties and Districts, or other portions of this
Colony and its Dependencies, and at such places res-
pectively, as the Governor should by Proclamation
for that purpose from time to time appoint; and
whereas by the last recited Act it was enacted, that
all Courts of Requests established or to be established
within the City of Sydney, and County of Cumberland,
and in the Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke,
should respectively have power and authority to hear
and determine, in a summary way, all actions whatso-
ever for the recovery of any debt, demand, or damage,

whether liquidated or unliquidated, to an amount not
exceeding thirty pounds; now I, the said Governor,
in pursuance of the power and authority so vested in
me, by the said first recited Act, do hereby direct
and appoint, that Courts of Requests in and for the
Town of Melbourne and County of Bourke, shall
be holden during the year one thousand eight hun-
dred and forty-eight, at the Town of Melbourne,
at the times hereinafter respectively mentioned, that
is to say:—

The Ordinary Sittings of the Court of Requests
for the Town of Melbourne, and County of Bourke,
for the trial of all cases not exceeding ten pounds,
shall be holden on the following days respectively,
viz.:—Monday, 3rd January; Monday, 7th Febru-
ary; Monday, 6th March; Monday, 3rd April;
Monday, 1st May; Monday, 5th June; Monday,
3rd July; Monday, 7th August; Monday, 4th
September; Monday, 2nd October; Monday, 6th
November; Monday, 4th December.

The new Sittings of the said Court for the trial
of all cases from ten to thirty pounds, shall be
holden on the following days respectively, viz.:—
Thursday, 10th February; Thursday, 6th April;
Thursday 8th June; Thursday, 3rd August;
Thursday, 5th October; Thursday, 7th December.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

ALL persons having claims on the Colonial Treasury are requested to furnish their accounts through the proper channel, before the end of the year, or as soon thereafter as practicable.

The several Collectors and Officers in the receipt of public monies, will pay over to the Colonial Treasurer, on or before the 31st of December, the amount of all collections remaining in their hands respectively up to that date, so that the entire Revenue collected by each, may be credited in the Accounts of the year within which it was received.

The Heads of Departments and other Officers, who have received advances to enable them to defray expenses incurred under their superintendence, are requested to furnish to the Audit Office, as far as practicable, and with all convenient despatch, the accounts of the expenditure thereof, and on or before the last day of December, to pay into the Colonial Treasury, the unexpended balance of such advances that the adjustment of the same may appear in the accounts to 31st proximo.

They will also, as soon as practicable, after the close of the year, bring forward all accounts of expenses incurred within the same, which do not admit of being previously settled, so that if possible all the expenses incurred in the present year may be finally adjusted and liquidated within one month after its termination.

The Colonial Treasurer is requested to use his endeavours to give effect to these directions, and to report through the proper channel, for the information of His Excellency the Governor, any instance of neglect in complying therewith, on the part of the Government Officers concerned.

COCKATOO ISLAND.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that Cockatoo Island, in the Harbour of Port Jackson, has been appointed a place at which Male Offenders under order or sentence of transportation, or under any order or sentence passed in pursuance of the provisions of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council, passed in the present year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act to substitute other punishments for Transportation beyond the Seas,*" shall be detained, and be liable to be kept to hard labor.

His Excellency also directs it to be notified, that under the provisions of the said Act, any person found at or near, or in any manner communicating with the said Island without the permission of the Governor, or other proper Officer, will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction, be liable to a fine or penalty of £20, or to imprisonment for three months, or both, of which all persons are hereby required to take notice.

FAMILIES OF EXILES.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct the re-publication of the following Notice.

*By His Excellency's Command,
E. DEAS THOMSON.*

HER Majesty's Government having determined to defray a moiety of the expense of conveying to this Colony the families of those married persons who arrived at Port Phillip as "Exiles" from Great Britain, His Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified that, in any case in which the Exile shall place in the hands of the Local Government a sum sufficient to cover one-half the expense of conveying his wife and children to the Colony, the other half will be defrayed by the Home Government.

Persons of this class, therefore, who are desirous of availing themselves of this indulgence, will make application accordingly to His Honor the Superintendent of Port Phillip, if still resident in that District, or otherwise to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts in Sydney.

As however, it will not be possible to predetermine the actual expense of providing passages for each such family, the applicants will be required to deposit in the Colony such a sum of money as will cover one moiety of the probable expense, calculated according to the following scale, and the balance (if any) after paying a moiety of the actual expense incurred, will be returned to the parties, namely:—

FAMILIES OF CONVICTS.

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR is pleased to direct the re-publication of the following Notice.

*By His Excellency's Command,
E. DEAS THOMSON.*

HIS Excellency the GOVERNOR directs it to be notified, that Her Majesty's Government have determined to revive the practice of forwarding to this Colony, at the public expense, the wives and families of married convicts who have become free by pardon or otherwise, or who have obtained tickets of leave, and who may be recommended by the GOVERNOR as worthy of that indulgence.

2. Those persons who have already obtained tickets of leave, or any higher degree of liberty, or whose terms of transportation have expired, and who may

be desirous of being joined by their families, will make application in the annexed form, to the Principal Superintendent of Convicts.

3. Every such application must be supported by the recommendation of two or more respectable persons known to the Government, and satisfactory assurance must be afforded that the applicant has the means of supporting his family.

4. In like manner, Convicts at present under sentence will be allowed to apply for the above indulgence, as soon as they have received tickets of leave, but not before.

5. Those persons whose applications were forwarded to the Secretary of State under the regulations of 6th May, 1833, but were not then complied with, will be required to make fresh applications in the accompanying form.

WHARFAGE AND TONNAGE RATES AT PUBLIC WHARVES.
