NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of the Act of the Governor and Council, 10th Victoria, No. 10—A Court of Petty Sessions, for the recovery of small debts, will be holden at the Police office, Belfast, on the first Saturday of each and every month, except when the same may fall on Christmas-day; then to be held on Saturday next following.

In each and every case when the defendant shall reside in the town of Belfast, or within 25 miles thereof, the plaintiff shall be filed at least 5 clear days, and the summons shall be served at least 3 days prior to the day named in the summons for the hearing of such case, and in each and every case, where the defendant shall reside at a greater distance than 25 miles, the plaintiff shall be filed at least seven days, and the summons shall be served at least five days prior to the day of hearing named in the summons.

In all cases the plea of defence or set-off, shall be filed at least one day prior to the setting of the Court.

Where it becomes necessary under this Act to tender to persons subpoenaed, a reasonable amount of expenses, six pence a mile shall be considered in all cases, for each mile from the residence of the person subpoenaed to the Court, and not to include the return distance, to be a good and sufficient tender; all other allowances for witnesses to be decided according to circumstances by the Bench of Magistrates or Magistrate, acting singly at the hearing of the case.
